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### MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS Thursday, October 31, 2013

### I. CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, the regular meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 9:10 a.m., Thursday, October 31, 2013. Present at the meeting were:

### II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. <u>September 26, 2013</u>: The Vice Chairperson made motion to approve the minutes of September 26, 2013 subject to correction. The motion was seconded by Mr. Benito and was unanimously passed.

### III. PUBLIC COMMENT

- a. **Public Comment:** None.
- b. **Employee Comment:** None.
- c. <u>PAGGMA Association</u>: Mr. Raymond B. Santos, Vice President of PAGGMA Association said the Port Week Opening Ceremony and Grand Finale was a success and thanked everyone for their support and contribution. The schedule of port week activities will be provided to the Board.

### IV. GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

The General Manager's report was provided for Board's information. Following key items of the report are as follows:

1. <u>Damage to Dock D at Agat Marina</u>: Mr. Felix R. Pangelinan, Interim Deputy General Manager mentioned that as a result of inclement weather from Tropical Storm Wipha on October 12, 2013, Dock D at the Agat Marina suffered 65% of damages. Efforts were made to remove the debris. Management is currently working on seeking the assistance from the front office to reprogram funds from Hagatna Marina Phase II project to support the replacement of docks C & D at Agat marina. The Chairman advised management to post signage at the site for the safety of the public and users.

The Vice Chairperson asked the impacts to the tenants in the area. Mr. Glenn B. Nelson, Commercial Manager said the tenants have been relocated to other areas and their tenancy will be based on real time application.

In relation, the Chairman asked the status of Agat marina dock A replacement. Mr. Nelson said the contract should be finalized shortly and the turnaround time is five months from the notice to proceed.

2. <u>Temporary Transfer of Golf Pier from Mobil to Cementon</u>: The Interim Deputy General Manager mentioned that Cementon Micronesia has since completed the installation of their pipeline project. A pressure test was performed without issue. Management will work with Cementon in finalizing their berthing window schedule.

### V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. <u>Cementon Micronesia</u>: (Item addressed under General Manager's report.)
- b. <u>GEDA Loan Status</u>: The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) said the language on the pledge of revenues is still under review with Bank of Guam counsel. Once completed, and after management review, will be submitted to the Public Utilities Commission.

### c. <u>Port Modernization Program-Implementation Plan:</u>

1. Master Plan Update: The Interim Deputy General Manager mentioned that an electronic copy of the latest version was forwarded to the Board and that hard copies will be provided if needed. Mr. Benito said the Board has seen the draft proposal and are familiar with its contents, unless there were major changes made from that time. The Interim Deputy General Manager said another internal review is being arranged and will advise the Board should they wish to attend.

### d. <u>Workers Compensation Insurance</u>:

1. <u>Legislation</u>: The Interim Deputy General Manager said the Port has sought the assistance of Senator Chris Duenas to introduce legislation. The proposed language is specific to Section 10111(e), Chapter 10, 12 GCA in allowing the Port to self-insure workman's

compensation. In the meantime, the Chairman understands that the Port has acquired workers compensation insurance as required by law. The Interim Deputy General Manager replied positively.

Port Compensation Structure Consultant Services: As discussed in previous meetings, the Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) requested for Board authorization to engage the professional services of Alan Searle and Associates for the maintenance of the compensation structure and classification plan through sole source procurement. The Chairman asked whether there is a compelling reason to proceed in acquiring professional services with this particular company. The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) understands that the Searle Study and Compensation Pay Structure was adopted back in October 2009 and in keeping with the creator of this product would not only allow for the completion of the compensation plan, but would also ensure the stability and continuity of the appropriate methods and The Vice Chairperson expressed discomfort in proceeding with sole source procurement given the attention of the Port. The Chairman inquired with counsel as to the sole source procurement. Legal Counsel mentioned that the Board would be authorizing management to proceed with a specific process for sole source procurement which is to determine whether it is necessary. He said as long as the necessity to proceed with this procurement method is established and justified, does not foresee this to be an issue. Legal Counsel mentioned that with professional services the head of the Purchasing Agency makes the determination. Chairman said based on the executive summary provided by management, it indicates that back in 2008, the professional service was issued through competitive solicitation which was then awarded to this company as the sole offeror at that time. He mentioned that if this professional service was issued through traditional bid rather than sole source, may have the benefit again of The Chairman appreciates the concerns expressed by the Vice being the sole offeror. Chairperson in that proceeding with sole source procurement may prompt undue criticism. The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) said the goal is for the Port to be given the opportunity to complete the compensation program to be able to administer the plan independently. At this time, management was directed to proceed with acquiring professional services for the maintenance of the compensation and classification plan through request for proposal.

(At this time of 9:40 a.m., the General Manager Joanne M.S. Brown joined the meeting.)

- f. Recruitment of Positions: The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) requested for Board authorization to allow management to fill funded positions that are vacant due to resignations, terminations or retirement. Any unfunded positions will be brought before the Board for approval. Mr. Benito made motion to authorize management to proceed with the recruitment of budgeted positions, seconded by the Vice Chairperson. In calling for the votes, the Chairman, the Vice Chairperson and Director Benito voted in favor of the motion. Director Gibson opposed. The motion on the floor was approved by a majority vote.
- g. <u>Budget Adjustment Request</u>: The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) said the Board authorized management to transfer funds within divisions. The request being brought before the Board is to allow transfer between divisions. The Interim Deputy General

Manager explained that there are two divisions under the Maintenance Department and should there be a need to transfer funds between divisions for purposes of critical maintenance and repair of equipments that management be allowed to do so.

The Vice Chairperson made motion to authorize management with the latitude to transfer repair and maintenance funds as the critical need arises within the Equipment Maintenance Repair Department. Motion was seconded by Mr. Benito and was unanimously approved.

h. **Procurement Updates:** The Chairman asked the status of the mobile screening system. The General Manager said the specifications are currently under review with Department of Public Works as they have oversight over all government of Guam means of transport and once completed, will be forwarded back one more time to the General Services Agency (GSA) for further processing. She reminded the Board that attempts to procure the system has been made over a year locally and in the event there continues to be no movement, then the alternative is to pursue federal general services agency. The General Manager expressed concern that it is a national requirement for the Port through Customs to have this capability.

As to the acquisition of generators, the General Manager reminded the Board that back in May 2013 the power lines at the Port had to be replaced, so the Port was relying on generator power for two weeks to address refrigeration capability for all cargoes. She said the Port has since that time been making efforts to work with GSA to procure generators that will meet U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) standards of Tier 4 for emissions and have encountered numerous challenges. There was a recent attempt to move the bid forward but was cancelled by GSA for reasons that a vendor claimed the specifications were not well written in which the Port disagrees and would have protested if GSA moved forward. The other factor claimed was that the requirement of Tier 4 is not in the market which is incorrect as there are manufacturers that meet these requirements. The Port is in a very critical situation of the need to acquire generators to ensure continued operation of the terminal yard, and more particularly with perishable cargoes. She expressed concern in the event there is a typhoon the Port will not be able to maintain itself. The Port has been experiencing procurement hurdles for the past few months which hampers the Port's ability to properly procure with federal funds the type of equipment to meet the specifications to be properly permitted by U.S. EPA as well as be in compliance with emission requirements. The General Manager further expressed that it would not be responsible for the Port to use federal funds and purchase generators that within a year will not meet the new emission standards by federal EPA and Guam EPA. She said the Port attempted to go through the Governor's authority of emergency procurement for the generators back in May 2013, but was relayed by GSA that it could not be done for reasons that such procurement would not be within the thirty day timeframe, and up to this point the Port has not had a bid issued to address the procurement of these generators that it direly needs.

Mr. Benito commented that this certainly rises to the level of emergency procurement and is in favor of seeking assistance from the front office. The Vice Chairperson agrees and commented that this is certainly an emergency situation considering the recent inclement weather and is concerned of the potential liability to the Port if all the perishable cargoes are ruined or damaged due to not having the proper generators in place. She mentioned that a timeframe

should be given to GSA to respond and if it is not met, the Port proceed with the emergency declaration. The Chairman advised management to regenerate letter to GSA seeking further assistance in the acquisition of the generator(s) outlining chronological events made by the Port and if unsuccessful, then proceed with emergency declaration through the front office.

i. <u>PUC Reports</u>: The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) said the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) will have port docket on the interim tariff at its next meeting in November 2013. The General Manager said if PUC concurs with the tariff increase, the Port will grant port users a thirty day grace period prior to implementation the opportunity to notify their customers of the new rates.

The Deputy General Manager Admin/Finance) recalled at the recent legislative confirmation hearing that questions were raised on the Port's filing reporting requirements to PUC. The Chairman advised management to send formal letter to Vice Speaker Benjamin Cruz advising that the Port is in compliance.

j. <u>Capital Improvement – Administration Tiling Project</u>: The General Manager said at the previous meeting, the Board authorized \$30K for the Admin tiling project. During the removal of the asbestos tiles other layers of tiles were identified which is an additional charge for its removal. Based on these findings, it is being requested to supplement the shortage not to exceed \$4K. The Vice Chairperson made motion to authorize management to identify funding source from capital improvement projects not to exceed \$4,000.00 needed to complete the Administration tiling project. Motion was seconded by Mr. Benito and was unanimously approved.

### VI. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. <u>Board Resolution Nos. 2013-09 thru 2013-14 Retirement:</u> The Vice Chairperson made motion to approve Board Resolution Nos. 2013-09 thru 2013-14 relative to commending and congratulating the retirement services from the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port for the following port employees: Edgar Martin, Hernando Ganon, Joe Ragasa, Antonio Susuico, Doris Sanchez, and Arthur Hopkins. The motion was seconded by Mr. Benito and was unanimously approved.
- 2. <u>Board Resolution No. 2013-15 Interest Bearing Account</u>: As directed at previous meetings, the Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) said management explored the possibility of earning interest on certain accounts with financial institutions doing business with the Port. As a result, management desires to open two separate interest bearing accounts of revenues realized from the Facility Maintenance Fee and the other account for 9.5% of the container surcharge. No fees will be assessed to open these accounts.

The Vice Chairperson made motion to approve Board Resolution No. 2013-15 relative to authorizing the Port Authority of Guam to open a Time Deposit Open Account, seconded by Mr. Benito. Motion was unanimously approved.

### 3. **Property Leasing & Development**

a. <u>Facility User Fees:</u> Mr. Nelson presented a proposed new fees for certain water and landside activities conducted on port property, specifically a vendor fee for all nontenant dive operators at Outhouse Beach and Facility use fees for the Family and Port Beach facilities. Management defers to legal counsel to determine whether the proposed new rates are to be guided by the Adjudication Act or Public Utilities Commission oversight.

The Vice Chairperson asked clarification in the use of Port Beach about water not being included. Mr. Nelson mentioned that upon permit issuance, staff will record the meter number before and after the event. Permit holders will only be assessed water consumption for their purpose and use. The Chairman advised legal counsel to determine the method of adoption either through the Adjudication Act or Public Utilities Commission.

b. **JanZ's Proposal:** Mr. Nelson said the Board had authorized management to terminate the agreement which was done in June 2013 and the effective termination date was 90 days there from; date being August 2013. The previous owner has since sold the restaurant and the new owner is requesting to continue the lease until such time the solicitation process of a new tenant is complete. In doing so, the new owner has proposed to pay an additional 10% on top of the existing fee schedule. Being requested from the Board is to authorize management to extend the lease on a month-to-month basis at the proposed rate structure until such time the solicitation process is completed.

The Chairman asked for the notification period to vacate lease properties. Mr. Nelson mentioned that the tenant will be granted 30 days to vacate port premise.

The Vice Chairperson made motion to authorize management to enter into a month-tomonth lease agreement until such time the solicitation process is completed, seconded by Mrs. Gibson. Motion was unanimously approved.

- c. <u>Agat Marina Dock D</u>: As earlier discussed, Mr. Nelson presented a project summary addressing the major damages sustained at the Agat marina resulting from tidal surges brought forward by a passing depression. The project description proposes two approaches for consideration:
  - 1. Outright replacement of the Agat Marina Dock D facility with aluminum frame, composite top decking; or
  - 2. Outright replacement of the Agat Marina Docks C & D facilities with aluminum frame, composite top decking.

Mr. Nelson said the funding source for this purpose is through the balance of \$227K remaining after the bid of Dock A as well as the reprogramming of \$950K remaining from the completion of the GDP Marina Phase II project. With respect to the reprogramming, the Port intends to submit request to the office of the Governor. The total funding source amounts to \$1,170,000.00 towards a possible two dock project.

Mr. Benito made motion to authorize management to reprogram lapse funds from the GDP Hagatna Marina Phase II project at \$950K and \$227K remainder from the Agat Marina Dock A repairs project for purposes of funding an outright replacement of Agat Marina Dock C and Dock D with aluminum frame, composite top decking. The motion was seconded by the Vice Chairperson and was unanimously approved.

4. <u>Gantry 3 Maintenance Contract</u>: On October 4, 2013, Matson submitted a claim of \$404,707.93 for work completed on the maintenance of Gantry Crane 3. The Interim Deputy General Manager mentioned that as a result of managements review, the outside labor and parts/materials amounts to \$370,306.76. Management will discuss this matter further with Matson.

The Chairman asked the status of the Performance Management Contract (PMC) for maintenance of the gantry cranes. The General Manager said the Port anticipates the PMC to be on board by December 2013. Mr. Benito asked management to provide an assessment of Gantry Crane 3 relative to maintenance cost and structural condition to determine its continued operational viability to the Port.

### 5. <u>Travel Authorization</u>:

a. <u>FEMA Grants Management Workshop, December 17-19, 2013, Emmetsburg, MD:</u> Mr. Benito made motion to approve travel authorization for port personnel to attend the FEMA Grants Management Workshop, December 17-19, 2013 held in Emmetsburg, Maryland, seconded by the Vice Chairperson. Motion was unanimously approved.

### VII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

No executive session discussed.

### VIII. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to discuss, it was moved by Mr. Benito and seconded by the Vice Chairperson to adjourn the meeting at 10:30 a.m. The motion was unanimously passed.

### Notification to Matson for FY 2014 for Crane Maintenance

On Tuesday, November 5, 2013, the GM sent a letter to Matson General Manger Bernie Valencia providing information on the Port's fiscal year 2014 budget which includes the object categories for Gantries 3, 4, 5, and 6. The GM relayed that the Port will continue with the previous process in place with Matson to address the ordering of "Parts and Materials." The GM requested an anticipated work schedule one week in advance for "Outside Labor" to include the names of the employees, hourly rates, total hours worked and daily work performance.

### Notice on Asan and Aguada Rivers Bridge Rehabilitation

On Tuesday, October 29, 2013, the GM received a notice from DPW Director Carl Dominguez related to the on Asan and Aguada Rivers Bridge Rehabilitation pre-construction conference that was held on Thursday, November 7, 2013. Terminal Superintendent Joe Ulloa attended this meeting on behalf of the Port.

DPW and FHWA anticipate the rehabilitation of these two bridges in 2014. This is of significance to the Port Users as traffic will be restricted to one-lane in both directions during the bridge repair periods. This will impact travel flow for cargo containers leaving and returning back to the Port.

Both bridge projects will involve the strengthening of the top slabs of the bridge structures to support the legal load requirements. Updates will be provided once construction timelines have been determined.

### Replacement of Bollards at Golf Pier

On Wednesday, October 30, 2013, the GM and Deputy GM for Operations met with Mobil Country Manager Jaime Ortega and Terminal Operations Manager Garet Oliveras to discuss the bollards at Golf Pier. According to Mr. Ortega, eight (8) bollards are in need of replacement. There are currently six (6) bollards located on Golf Pier and two (2) bollards that are located on land that support Golf Pier. Earlier this year Mobil coordinated with the Port for the replacement of another on island bollard providing service to Golf Pier. Mr. Ortega is requesting the assistance of the Port to review an assessment of the bollards and work with Mobil on a replacement plan.

The GM responded to Mr. Ortega that the Port would provide an assessment of the existing eight (8) bollards and coordinate back with Mobil. In the event that the bollards have to be replaced, an estimated cost package will be put together for the Port and Board review. The replacement earlier this year of the one (1) on land bollards cost an estimated \$50,000. The GM for Operations is in the process of addressing the inspection and coordination with Mobil on the requested bollard replacement.

### Meeting with Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) on Agat Marina

On Wednesday, November 6, 2013, the GM and Deputy GM for Operations met with ACOE Deputy District Engineer for Programs and Project Management Anthony Paresa, P.E., Chief for the Civil & Public Works Branch Derek Chow and ACOE Guam Field Project Manager Ryan Winn. Also present on behalf of the Port were Chief Planner Dot Harris, Engineer Manager Simeon Delos Santos, Maintenance Manager Ernie Candoleta, Commercial Manager Glenn Nelson, Acting Superintendent for Facilities and Maintenance Ray Munoz and Commercial Specialist II Rita Carbullido.

Mr. Paresa and Mr. Chow provided an overview of current ACOE projects in the Northern Marinas to include Saipan, Tinian and Rota, and relayed the process for pursing project funding to address mitigation projects that require ACOE technical expertise and construction. They also discussed the ranking of project request in relation to high and low volume use related to navigation safety. Mr. Chow discussed the Water Resource Development Act of 2013 that provides ACOE funding and relayed that similar acts were addressed by Congress in 2000 and 2007. The Act included an amendment to Remote and Subsistence Harbor Authority and amended four (4) criteria concerning remote areas in small communities. Mr. Chow further relayed that this was of significance to areas such as Guam, Hawaii, Alaska, CNMI, American Samoa and the Virgin Islands as these areas are primarily dependent for survival of resources transported over water. This new criteria allows these listed jurisdictions to have an opportunity to compete for ACOE assistance without having to compete for economic justifications with mainland states. Mr. Chow further stated that the territories also receive a \$200,000 waiver for federal matching requirements.

The GM provided an overview of the current situation at the Agat Marina to include the damage to Dock D as a result of Tropical Storm Wipha last month. She also discussed the issues related to the rip currents that flow through the Agat Marina entering on the Dock D side and exiting on the Dock A side of the marina. Now that the Port is evaluating the funding cost and other requirements to address the replacement of Dock D and the approved construction of Dock A, the flow of the rip currents impacts the protection of docks and the boats located at the marina.

The GM went on to relay that concerns were raised since the Agat Marina was designed by the ACOE and constructed over 25 years ago. Mr. Chow responded that an assessment of the marina would need to be conducted to determine what would be needed to address the rip current issues and possible maintenance dredging of accumulated sediment. Possible studies would include technical, engineering, environmental and energy studies. This could also include a Regional Sediment Management study to determine impacts to adjacent areas that may include Nimitz Beach.

Mr. Paresa and Mr. Chow were provided with a copy of the GM's recent letter that was sent on Tuesday, October 29, 2013 to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers District (ACOE) Engineer Lieutenant Colonel Thomas Asbery requesting the assistance of the Honolulu District to address the breakwater modification located at the Agat Boat Marina. Mr. Paresa and Mr. Chow also relayed that they would visit the Agat Marina with Mr. Winn while they are on island so that they would have a preliminary idea of concerns and issues raised by the Port. They relayed that the letter to Colonel Asbery will initiate the process and recommendations by the ACOE on the corrective actions needed at the Agat Marina.

### Port Master Plan Update

On Wednesday, November 6, 2013, Port Management and Board Member Benito conducted a collective review of the proposed revisions to the Port Master Plan. Chief Planner Dot Harris provided a slide presentation overview on the proposed changes and modifications as a result of downsized activities related to the proposed military buildup and the organic growth needs of the Port.

The review and approval of the Port Board on the revisions of the Port Master Plan is requested to be addressed at this Board meeting. Once the Master Plan is approved by the Board, it will be transmitted to the Bureau of Statistics and Plans (BSP) as outlined under GCA Title 5, Chapter 1, Sections 1205 - Plan Review Public Hearings, through Section 1206 - Plan Adoption. A public hearing will be held by BSP within forty-five (45) days after receiving the Master Plan. After the completion of the public hearing, BSP must transmit the Plan to the Governor with its recommendations and a "Summary of testimony" from the public hearing. The Governor has sixty (60) calendar days to act on the Plan. Once the Governor approves the Plan, it must be transmitted to the Guam Legislature within 10 calendar days. The Legislature will then have sixty (60) days to approve or disapprove the Plan. In the event that the Legislature does not act on the Plan within the allotted timeframe, the Plan will be deemed as approved.

A copy will also be forwarded to the Secretary of the Navy for his review and approval pursuant to Quit Claim Deed N627493RP00079.

### Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the Phase II Gregorio D. Perez Marina Renovation & Site Improvement Project

On Thursday, November 7, 2013, a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony was held for the Phase II of the Gregorio D. Perez Marina Renovation & Site Improvement Project.

Board Chairman Dan Tydingco provided welcoming remarks on behalf of the Port and thanked the Port staff and contractor Black Construction for all their efforts to deliver the completion of the project several months earlier than anticipated. Senior Vice President and General Manager for Black Construction Corporation Leonard Kaae also recognized his employees and N.C. Marcario & Associates for their contribution to the design and construction of the project. He relayed that Black Construction was very pleased to have been contracted to build phase I and Phase II of the Marina and joking relayed that Black would also be happy to construct Phase III if his company were to win the bid. Governor Eddie Calvo provided the Key Note Address and spoke about the continued improvements and develops at the Agana Marina and the anticipated new construction at the Agat Marina. He recognized the family members of Gregorio D. Perez that were also present to celebrate the completion of this project. The GM provided closing remarks on behalf of the Port and thanked the employees, contractor, A&E designer and the Department of Interior for providing the funding for the project. The Captain of the Port Casey White was also present for the ceremony.

The construction cost of the project is \$1,735,691. 53 and was funded by the Department of the Interior Office of Insular Affairs grant. Approximately 533.2 linear feet was renovated to replace existing steel sheet piles, repair walkways, new concrete walkway, new riprap and the construction of a new storm water deep sump catch basin and drainage system. The project commenced on Wednesday, February 6, 2013 and was completed by Black Construction Corporation on Friday, October 18, 2013.

### **Port Safety Issues**

### Damage at F-3 from Aggregate Operation

On Wednesday, October 30, 2013, the GM was notified by Safety Inspector III Paul Salas that pavement on the east end of F-3 was damaged by a metal ramp that was scraping in a back and forth motion when the vessel (Barge-S-7000) was listing. The metal support from the ramps caused the pavement of chip off. The incident had occurred on the same day.

According to Mr. Salas, the Norton Lilly Agent Patrick Dormal instructed his representatives to clean the area and repair the damages to the asphalt. The Harbor Master was notified of the damages.

### Industrial Accident on Board the GB Atlantic

On Wednesday, October 30, 2013, the GM received a report from Safety Officer III Paul Salas concerning an industrial accident on board the GB Atlantic located at F-3. According to Mr. Salas on Friday, October 25, 2013, the ship's crew from the GB Atlantic were operating the ships gear and hoisting a pontoon from the dockside when it swayed outward and struck two fuel pit guards. The fuel pit guards were damaged on impact. Mr. Salas elaborated in his report that the pontoon was not centered with the boom when it was hosted. T

The incident had been witnessed by Sanko Bussan Agent Mike Maras. Fortunately, there were no personnel injuries. Mr. Salas concluded that the cause of the incident was due to inattention on the part of the operator and was referred to the Accident Review Board for further determination.

### Industrial Accident on Board the GB Atlantic

On Wednesday, October 30, 2013, the GM received a report from Safety Officer III Paul Salas concerning another industrial accident on Board the GB Atlantic that had occurred on Sunday, October 27, 2013. Mr. Salas stated in his report that the ship's crew were operating the ship's gear and hoisting a pontoon from dockside when the pontoon swayed inward and struck the roof edge of Warehouse I. As a result pieces of cement broke off on impact.

Mr. Salas went on to relay that the pontoon was not centered with the boom when hoisted prior to striking the roof of Warehouse I. Mechanic II Robert Lau witnessed the incident.

Mr. Salas concluded that the cause of the incident was inattention on the part of the operator. He recommended that this matter be forwarded to the Accident







### Gantry Crane 3 Report November 12, 2013

PURPOSE: An assessment and evaluation was performed on Gantry Crane 3 to determine its operational and economical viability as port asset.

BACKGROUND: Gantry Crane 3 is a 1983 40 Long Ton Hitachi Crane, 50 gauge container handling gantry crane from Subic Bay, Philippines that was acquired through Matson and Horizon in 1989. Through a memorandum of agreement, the Port took ownership of Gantry Crane 3 in December 2012 as a result of its acquisition of the POLA cranes.

### ANALYSIS:

The following analysis provides a breakdown on Gantry Crane 3 for a period of three years which includes operational and performance activity; and cost associated with repair and maintenance, outside labor, and overtime. The breakdown does not include fuel consumption per year that amounts to approximately \$65,000.00.

However, at this time, the Port anticipates a rail change-out of Gantry Crane 5 that is scheduled to commence on April 2014 to be completed no later than June 2014 which would necessitate the operational use of Gantry Crane 3 during this time period. In connection to this rail change-out, it is also important to consider the ongoing projects that consist of the Guam Commercial Port Improvement Program (GCPI) construction activities as well as the service life extension of the F5 wharf repair.

WHEREAS, the Port responded to the DoD re-set by formulating a Balanced Modernization Program to include Marine Service Life Extension and a reduction in Phase 1A to remain within the available Port Enterprise Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the Port's OAE, PB, prepared the Port Authority of Guam 2013 Master Plan Update, which provides a comprehensive view of the Port's current condition, identifies elements of continuous improvement and sustainability; and

WHEREAS, an Implementation Plan was developed in conjunction with the Port Authority of Guam 2013 Master Plan Update that evaluated Port improvement and sustainability requirements, and determined a balance approach for meeting these requirements; and
