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**MINUTES OF THE
REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
Tuesday, November 12, 2013**

I. CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, the regular meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 11:50 a.m., Tuesday, November 12, 2013. Present at the meeting were:

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- a. **October 31, 2013:** Mr. Benito made motion to approve the minutes of October 31, 2013 subject to correction. The motion was seconded by Ms. Gibson and was unanimously passed.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT

- a. **Public Comment:** None.
- b. **Employee Comment:** None.
- c. **PAGGMA Association:** Mr. Raymond B. Santos, Vice President of PAGGMA Association announced the schedule of the remaining port week activities which include the karaoke and chili contest as well as the dart and golf tournament. He also mentioned that the PAGGMA association Christmas party will be celebrated at the Nikko Hotel on December 14, 2013.

IV. GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

The General Manager's report was provided for Board's information. Following key items of the report are as follows:

1. Notification to Matson for FY2014 for Crane Maintenance: Matson was provided with a breakdown of FY2014 budget as it relates to the maintenance of the object categories for gantry cranes 3, 4, 5, 6.
2. Notice on Asan and Aguada Rivers Bridge Rehabilitation: Department of Public Works has provided notice that along with Federal Highway Administration anticipates the rehabilitation of two bridges in 2014. The concern of the Port is whether the bridge will be able to accommodate constant activity of truck loads traversing over the bridge. Also, during construction will impact traffic as the two lane traffic will be reduced to one lane each way, impacting cargo flow to and from the Port.
3. Replacement of Bollards at Gulf Pier: Discussion was held with Mobil representatives on October 30, 2013 regarding the replacement of six bollards at Gulf Pier and two additional on land that supports Gulf Pier. An assessment will be conducted on the pier.
4. Meeting with Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) on Agat Marina: On November 6, 2013, a meeting was held with representatives of the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) and had discussed issues with regards Agat marina. ACOE representatives provided a general overview with regards to ongoing projects in the Northern Marianas. As to Agat marina, it was relayed that a possible assessment will be performed to determine what can be done at the marina.
5. Port Master Plan Update: On November 6, 2013, management conducted an internal general overview on the proposed changes and modifications of the port master plan update as a result of the downsized activities related to the proposed military buildup and the organic growth needs of the Port. Upon approval by the Board, the plan will then be transmitted to the Bureau of Statistics and Plans (BSP) as outlined under Chapter 1, Title 5, GCA, specific to Sections 1205 and 1206 for the holding of public hearings. BSP will transmit recommendation to the Governor for review; thereafter, the plan will be forwarded to the Guam Legislature for final approval.
6. Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the Phase II Gregorio D. Perez Marina Renovation & Site Improvement Project: A ribbon cutting ceremony was held on November 7, 2013 for the Phase II completion of the Gregorio D. Perez Marina renovation and site improvement project. This project was funded by the Department of Interior Office of Insular Affairs grant. Approximately 533.2 linear feet was renovated to replace existing steel sheet piles, repair walkways, new concrete walkway, new riprap and the construction of a new storm water deep sump catch basin and drainage system. The project commenced on February 2013 and was completed on October 2013 well under budget and within the timeframe.

In response to a query on whether a request has been made to the Governor regarding the reprogramming of the remaining grant funds to provide financial support to other port projects, the General Manager replied positively.

At this time of 12:00 p.m., Chairman Daniel J. Tydingco joins in on the meeting through telephonic participation.

V. OLD BUSINESS

a. **Cementon Micronesia:** At this time and without objections, Mr. John Perez, Cementon representative was allowed to address the Board. Mr. Perez thanked the members and said Cementon has completed the pipeline construction and returned the pier back to Mobil. Mobil has provided Cementon with two vessel window schedule opportunity, one in late November 2013 and the other in early December 2013. Mr. Perez mentioned that logistics are currently being worked on with the shipping company as to the time schedule and any other requirements necessary for the Port. He expressed gratitude of thanks to the members with regard to this project.

b. **GEDA Loan Status:** The Deputy General Manager (Admin/Finance) said contact was made with Bank of Guam this morning as to the status of the language on the pledge of revenues and was advised that such review currently remains with Bank of Guam's counsel.

c. **Port Modernization Program-Implementation Plan:** As to the master plan update, Mr. Benito commented that aside from minor changes to be made, was comfortable with the overall port modernization plan. The General Manager said there were some updates that needed to be incorporated, but nothing substantive. The Chairman and Ms. Gibson also expressed comfort with the master plan update.

At this time and as the matter relates, the Board members entertained item 1. Board Resolution No. 2013-16 – Port Master Plan under new business.

1. **Board Resolution No. 2013-16 – Port Master Plan:** Mr. Benito pointed out that the 2013 master plan update as presented does not deviate from the original 2007 master plan update presented to the Guam Legislature back in 2008. The General Manager said the master plan basically provides general guidelines on how to proceed, and with the setback or extended timeline of the military buildup which was originally anticipated is not the reality today. She mentioned that the 2013 master plan update does not deviate from its original 2007 master plan update, but rather provides a downscale to present day reality in terms of the viability, finances and resources.

Mr. Benito made motion to approve Board Resolution No. 2013-16 relative to approving the Port Authority of Guam 2013 Master Plan Report, seconded by the Chairman. The motion was unanimously approved.

d. **Workers Compensation Insurance – Legislation:** No new developments to report on the legislation from the previous meeting, other than continued follow-ups will be made with Senator Chris Duenas. The General Manager reminded the Board that with respect to workers compensation insurance, the Port has been with coverage since October 2013.

e. **Gantry 3 Maintenance:** The Interim Deputy General Manager presented an assessment of Gantry Crane 3 for years 2011 thru present and mentioned that for a total three year period the breakdown are as follows:

- Operations hours – 3,438.50
- Container lifts – 41,524
- Maintenance expenditure – \$5,694,191.50

As a result of the assessment, it is determined that the usage versus the cost associated to maintain the crane far exceeds its actual hours of operation and performance activity and therefore, management recommends to decommission Gantry 3. However, as the Port anticipates a rail change-out to commence on April 2014 thru June 2014 would necessitate the operational use of Gantry 3 during such time period. The Vice Chairperson clarified that Gantry 3 would remain operational until the completion of the rail change-out project then afterwards Gantry 3 would be taken off-line. The Interim Deputy General Manager replied positively.

The Chairman asked for the plans in taking down Gantry 3 with respect to surveying of the equipment. The General Manager understands that earlier this year the Port Oversight Chair introduced legislation to allow the value of the surveyed equipment to go back to the Port. She mentioned the monies received from the survey could be used for continued equipment maintenance or acquisition when necessary. The Chairman agrees with management's recommendation on the decommissioning of Gantry 3 at the recommended timeline. Mr. Benito pointed out that the important factor is the Port has three POLA cranes which are sufficient to handle existing loads and any increased loads from the military buildup. He understands that the cost in the maintenance of Gantry 3 far exceeds the cost of running all three POLA cranes which does not seem practical. He wondered whether board action is necessary to provide management with clear direction on how to proceed. The Interim Deputy General Manager replied that board action is not necessary at this time. Mr. Benito expressed that management should stay on track with its recommendation in taking Gantry 3 off-line because it is expensive.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

2. **Board Resolution No. 2013-17 – Board Member:** The Chairman made motion to approve Board Resolution No. 2013-17 relative to recognizing and appreciating Mr. Eduardo R. Ilao for his contributions and service to the Port Authority of Guam as a member of the Board of Directors. The motion was seconded by Mr. Benito and was unanimously approved.

3. **Travel Authorization:**

a. **FEMA Emergency Management Institute Master Training Program, December 2-5, 2013, Maryland:** Ms. Gibson made motion to approve travel authorization for port personnel to attend the FEMA Emergency Management Institute Master Training Program, December 2-5, 2013 held in Maryland, seconded by Mr. Benito. Motion was unanimously approved.

b. **FEMA Center for Radiological / Nuclear Training, December 9-13, 2013, Las Vegas, Nevada:** Ms. Gibson made motion to approve travel authorization for port personnel to attend the FEMA Center for Radiological / Nuclear Training, December 9-13, 2013, Las Vegas, Nevada, seconded by Mr. Benito. Motion was unanimously approved.

c. **MARAD Announcement Master Plan / Congressional Ports Caucus, December 9-10, 2013, Washington DC:** Mr. Benito made motion to approve travel authorization for Board of Directors Chairman, Vice Chairperson and the Port General Manager to attend the MARAD Announcement Master Plan / Congressional Ports Caucus in December 2013. Motion was seconded by Ms. Gibson and was unanimously approved. It was noted that the travel date for December 2013 is being arranged to coordinate with the Governor's schedule.

Legal Service Billings

Without objections, the Chairman asked whether the Attorney General's office have responded to the legal services billings of Port legal counsel. The General Manager said a copy of the board meeting minutes where the Board approved legal service payments have been provided to the Attorney General's office. A follow-up will be made accordingly.

VII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

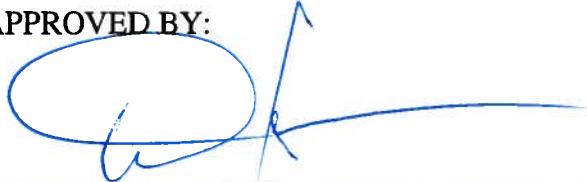

General Port Operations

Increased Shipping Rates for Matson

On Tuesday, November 26, 2013, Matson publicly announced an increase of \$350 per shipping container that would be transported between the West Coast to Guam. The new rates are scheduled to be implemented by January 2014. The new fees include \$275 for shipping service to the Marianas and Micronesia and an additional \$75 for handling cost at the West Coast Terminals.

The Port has not received an official notice from Matson concerning its rate increase.

Gantry 3 Labor Maintenance with Matson

In follow-up to the GM's September Report concerning the claim from Matson for additional charges for the labor cost for Gantry 3, the Port reviewed the invoice provided by Matson. The budget for FY 2013 provided \$700,000 for outside labor and \$250,000 for parts and materials for a total of \$950,000. The Port has determined that the additional claim from Matson amounts to \$370,306.76 for outside labor with a total of \$404,985.52. Port management is requesting the Board's approval to pay Matson's claim for additional labor cost. A memorandum has been included in the Board Member folders with a cost breakdown of the invoices for this request.

Meetings with Parsons

Port management met with PB Jeff Peck and his team on Tuesday, November 12, 2013 to discuss the intended projects and schedule for the week related to the design work primarily for Hotel Wharf, and the updates to the Port's Modernization Plan. Mr. Peck also held a close out meeting with Port management on Thursday, November 14, 2013.

MOA between PAG and DPW on Cabras Island Properties

On Wednesday, November 27, 2013, the Port GM signed the Memorandum of Agreement between the Port and the Department of Public Works related to Cabras properties under the jurisdictions of both parties. In order to finalize the completion of the Route 11 road

construction project funded by DOD/FHWA, rights -of -way issues relation to Port properties needed to be addressed. According to the agreement, DPW will "possess the roadway surface pavement structural section and lands to a depth of 24 inches . . ." In return, DPW will provide the Port "construction easements to the Port for the area identified in the Master plan update 2007 in the event the transfer is not recorded prior to MARAD awarding the Port's Expansion Construction Contract. Both parties will determine a mutually agreeable layout of construction easements as to not impede the Port's expansion construction."

GPA request to grade and backfill Portion of Parcel 1 for Parking

On Thursday, November 7, 2013, the Port received a letter of request from GPA General Manager Joaquin Flores to allow GPA to place additional base course material and level the existing footprint of the parking area at the GPA Cabras Power Plant. GPA has been using a portion of Port property at Parcel 1 for vehicle parking due to Critical Infrastructure Protection measures that prohibit privately owned vehicles from parking in the GPA Cabras Plant Compound. The GM spoke with GPA General Manager Joaquin Flores on Friday, November 29, 2013. Mr. Flores acknowledged the Port's ownership of Parcel 1, the current parking lot for the Cabras facility. He reiterated that GPA only plans to apply base course to smooth over the parking area to reduce pot holes and reduce the mud that is tracked onto Route 11.

The GM asked Mr. Flores for the assistance of GPA to maintain the grass cutting on both sides of the road from the intersection of Route 1 and Route 11 near the Cabras Power plant to the area before the Truck Enforcement Screening Station. The Port currently maintains all grass cutting of the shore line roadway of Route 11 across from Cabras and the remaining areas of Route 11 leading to Family Beach.

Responsible Boards and Commission Education Act (P.L. 32-031)

On Tuesday, November 26, 2013, Board Appointee Frank Santos addressed the requirements of the Responsible Boards and Commission Education Act to be versed on "procurement laws, as applicable, applicable statutes, executive orders, and rules and regulations which govern the board or commission and their respective areas of purview." The GM met with Board Appointee Santos to review these requirements.

Board Appointee Santos was provided a binder that contained information related to the following requirements: Procurement, Ethics in Government, FOIA Request, Open Government Law, Roberts Rules of Order and other relevant information.

The GM submitted a written memorandum to the Governor on Wednesday, November 27, 2013 certifying that the requirements of his order have been met with regards to the Port Board Members.

KM&T

On Monday, November 18, 2013, the GM, Deputy GM for Operations and the Commercial Manager Glenn Nelson met with the following representatives from KM&T. Present on behalf of KM&T were Mr. Albert Tsutsui, Nippon Express Group General Manager, Mitsuaki Shimazu, Nippon Express Consultant for U.S. Government Programs Advisor, Matson Team Iva Hosaka, Nippon Express Assistant Group Manager Harry Sawa, Nippon Express Air Cargo Representative and Overseas Courier Service for Guam Office President Takao Kuba and ODCMT Material Corporation Executive Vice-President Masako Tsuchya.

Representatives from KM&T has previously held a teleconference with Port representatives on October 22, 2013, to provide a status update on their companies interest to lease a portion of Parcel 1 to construct a pier that is intended to receive aggregate and cement products.

Ms. Hosaka provided the translation for Mr. Shimazu and Mr. Sawa who had previously attended a meeting with the Port on July 5, 2013. Mr. Sawa on behalf of KM&T provided a presentation on the proposed project objectives, the role of Nippon Express and the current status of the company's initiative that is still pending confirmation on the fiscal viability of the project. According to Mr. Sawa, "The primary rational supporting the building and managing of a pier facility in Guam's M1 District is to service the receipt of construction materials for the Guam Build-up." As these details are still pending, KM&T is awaiting further determination if the build-up process is to move forward. Nevertheless, the company is still reviewing logistics and requirements related to construction, facility maintenance and labor requirements. KM&T relayed in their presentation that the company is looking to construct a deck pier and has several proposed configuration options.

Deputy GM for Operations relayed current challenges being faced by the Port with regards to F-5 that was constructed as a deck rather than a filled pier after the 1993 earthquake. He recommended that KM&T may want to re-evaluate the longevity of this type pier construction. The GM also stated that the Port is currently in the process of addressing the Service Life Extension (SLE) for F-5 as structural issues need to be addressed that will take up a substantial amount of a \$10 million dollar loan currently being pursued by the Port.

The Deputy GM informed the KM&T representatives that the company could not be in competition for services provided by the Port. The meeting concluded with KM&T relaying that they would notify the Port once a determination is made.

PUGG Meeting of November

The PUGG Meeting was held on Thursday, November 21, 2013. Present on behalf of the Port was the GM, Deputy GM for Finance and Administration, Deputy GM for Operations, Operations Manager, Chief Planner, Commercial Manager, and Building Maintenance Supervisor Ray Munoz. Present on behalf of Matson was Vessel Operations Manager Tom Dillon.

Operations Manager John Santos provided an update on the demolition of Warehouse 2 that would commence after the Thanksgiving Holiday. The construction company has already completed the placement of barriers around the warehouse. He also relayed that with the construction of the new security building, he will provide notice to Port tenants concerning the micro ducting activity needed to install the security lines. Mr. Santos stated that he is still awaiting a decision from TriStar on when the company plans to address the repairs to its fuel lines that run through the yard as this will also impact traffic operations.

Mr. Dillon inquired as to the status of the main air-conditioning units in the Administration Building. He relayed that tenants have had to purchase separate split units. Mr. Nelson responded that his division is reviewing an off-set to tenants with regards to the issue. The GM relayed that she understood the concern as the Port has also incurred additional cost with the purchase of split unit air conditioners as the two main units have been down. According to Mr. Munoz the replacement units arrived in August and are awaiting installation. The GM will follow up with Building Maintenance as to the issues regarding the installation and if there is a need to contract out this project.

Mr. Santos also discussed the schedules for gantry operations and the GM provided an update on the community area renovations to include the replacement of the hallway floor that began that week.

Meeting with DOA on the GSA Tenda Charge Account

On Wednesday, November 27, 2013, the GM, Deputy GM for Finance and Administration and Acting Financial Affairs Controller, Joann Conway met with DOA Director Benita Manglona and Financial Manager Goody Rosario concerning the current cap of \$15,000 per month for the Port to purchase supplies. The cost of fuel purchased by the Port can consume the monthly allocation of \$15,000 with very limited funds left to purchase other needed supplies.

The Port previously met with DOA back in March to request the lifting of \$15,000 cap and also provided a letter to the Director of DOA formally requesting that the cap be lifted.

The GM relayed that she along with the Acting Financial Affairs Controller, and General Accounting Supervisor had met Acting Deputy Financial Manager Goody Rosario and Accountant I Andy Quinata on Wednesday, March 20, 2013 to find an alternative to the current limitations placed on the procurement of supplies. However, since this time, no action has been taken to address this request.

Director Manglona relayed that she did not have an objection to the cap being lifted. The GM responded that the Port is requesting a \$50,000 supply cap to address its current needs. The GM also reiterated that the Port had already made a commitment to working with DOA on an outstanding balance of \$80,076.95 that extends back prior to 1999. The Port received a report from the DOA Accounting Office that shows a breakdown of this total and has committed to working with DOA to address resolution for these outstanding amounts.

The GM will provide an update on this matter once she receives formal notice from DOA.

Merit Bonus and Increment for Retirees and Inactive Employees

In follow-up to previous Board request concerning the Merit Bonus and Increment for Retirees and Inactive Employees, the Port staff has completed the review of its records and determined that the total cost to address payment owed to 70 retirees and inactive employees totals \$191,795.00, with a total of \$183,690 for merit bonuses and \$8,105.00 for increments.

According to the GM for Finance and Administration, the portion of funds appropriated for new positions approved for the FY 2014 budget, which have yet to be hired since October 2013, is recommended as a source of funding to pay for the Merit Bonus and increments owed to former employees. This decision requires Board approval.

Port Tour for Board Members

On Thursday, November 21, 2013, Port management provided a tour of the Port Yard and facilities to include Hotel Wharf to Vice Chairperson Baleto and Board Member Shelly Gibson.

Swearing-in Ceremony for New Board Member

Mr. Francisco G. Santos was sworn in as the Port's newest Board Member by Governor Eddie Baza Calvo on Wednesday, November 27, 2013. Present on behalf of the Port were the GM and Deputy GM for Finance and Administration. Board Member Santos was appointed by Governor Calvo to the Port Board on October 8, 2013. His confirmation was held on October 22, 2013.

MagPro Awards Ceremony

Port Management and employees participated at the MagPro Awards Ceremony that was held on Thursday, November 21, 2013, at the Leo Palace Resort. All Port awardees were present to receive their trophies and certificates of recognition.

The Port will schedule another presentation to recognize all Port employees that were nominated by their respective Divisions.

Drive for Typhoon Yolanda

The Port participated in two collection efforts at the ITC intersection held on Friday, November 15, 2013 and Friday, November 22, 2013. The Port also conducted its own collection efforts over a two day period and provided a donation of \$1,030.12 to the relief efforts.

Port Safety Issues

Replacement of Fire Extinguishers

On Friday, November 29, 2013, Safety Inspector III Paul Salas informed the GM that all fire extinguishers had been inspected and that twelve (12) extinguishers need to be replaced. A requisition has been initiated to replace the extinguishers. All other extinguishers at the Port are operational and have met annual inspection requirements.

Legislative Matters

Public Law 32-010

On Tuesday, November 19, 2013, the Port received a memorandum from Senator Thomas Morrison, dated Wednesday, November 6, 2013, concerning Public Law 32-010 that established the Office of Technology that has the "authority to oversee, advise and make recommendations on the government's technical infrastructure." Senator Morrison relayed that Governor Calvo had appointed Mr. Joey Manibusan the Acting Chief Technology Officer to oversee the office. Senator Morrison requested for all agency heads and directors to review the public law and coordinate technology initiatives with the Chief Technology Officer. This information was relayed to the Port's Acting Systems Manager and notification was provided to all Division Managers during their weekly meeting with the GM.

Bill No. 157-32

On Wednesday, November 13, 2013, the Board Chairman Dan Tydingco relayed that he had been informed by Senator Ada of Bill No. 157-32, "Relative to the proceeds derived from the disposal of excess or surplus supplies and equipment that are the property of the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Port Authority of Guam." The bill will provide that the "net proceeds from the disposal of PAG surplus supplies and equipment go back to PAG for the purpose of supplementing its operations and maintenance budget."

The current practice to date for proceeds derived by GSA from the sale of Port supplies and equipment has been credited to the General Fund. If Bill No. 157-32 is signed into law, "ninety-percent (90%) of the total proceeds from the sale, lease or disposal shall revert to the Port Authority of Guam and the remaining ten percent (10%) of the total proceeds shall be deposited into the Guam Procurement Advisory Council Support Fund. . ." The bill also requires that the Port Board of Directors approve the "transfer, sell, trade-in, or otherwise dispose of supplies and equipment owned by the Port Authority of Guam."

As the Port is in the process of addressing the removal of Gantry 2, RTGs, and surveyed tractors among other equipment, the Port would like the proceeds from the surveyed equipment to be returned to the Port to pay for much needed equipment maintenance and new equipment as approved by the PAG Board. The funds that purchased these items came from revenue generated by the Port. The Port does not receive proceeds from the General Fund.

Legislative Oversight Hearing

On Friday, November 15, 2013, the Port received a notice from Senator Tom Ada that the Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation will conduct an Oversight Hearing on the Port Authority of Guam on Tuesday, December 17, 2013 at 2:00pm in the legislative Public Hearing Room.

Senator Ada identified the following issues that would be included in the agenda:

1. PAG Master Plan Update
2. Gantry Cranes
3. Service Life Extension (SLE) Loan (\$10M Bank of Guam)
4. Owner Agent Engineer (OAE) Professional Services

The Senator stated in his letter that more details would be provided by Friday, November 22, 2013.

 - a. Status of the crane maintenance PMC contract?
 - b. Will PMC follow Port developed Structured Maintenance Program or will PMC be creating their own?
 - c. Status of G2 and RTG disposal?
 - d. PAG plans on G3?
3. Service Life Extension (SLE) Loan.
 - a. What is the delay on issuance of IFB for SLE construction?
 - b. Are there any concerns that conditions have deteriorated further with the extensive delays, ie. more damage has occurred?

4. Owner Agent Engineer (OAE) Professional Services.
 - a. What is the OAE currently working on?
 - b. What are the near-term initiatives that need to be handed off to the Port as the OAE departs in February?
 - c. Is the Port now prepared to complete near-term initiatives and what is outlined in the new Master Plan without owner/agent assistance?

Freedom of Information Request

Request from Attorney Georgette Bello Concepcion Representing Ms. Francine Rocio on previous FOIA Request from KUAM

On Tuesday, November 19, 2013, the Port received a letter from Attorney Georgette Bello Concepcion representing former Port employee Francine Rocio requesting KUAM's FOIA request dated March 26, 2013 and the Port's response to such request, KUAM's FOIA request dated April 1, 2013 and the Port's response to such request, to include all documents that were provided to KUAM as a result of their FOIA requests.

As reported to the Board in October, Ms. Rocio had previously requested the information on September 25, 2013. The Port provided an initial response on September 30, 2013 requesting additional time to review the documents. On October 4, 2013 and the Port had provided a response and relayed that as the records requested relate to an ongoing investigation and pending litigation to which the agency is a party the request for information was denied pursuant to 5 GCA Section 10108 (a) and (b).

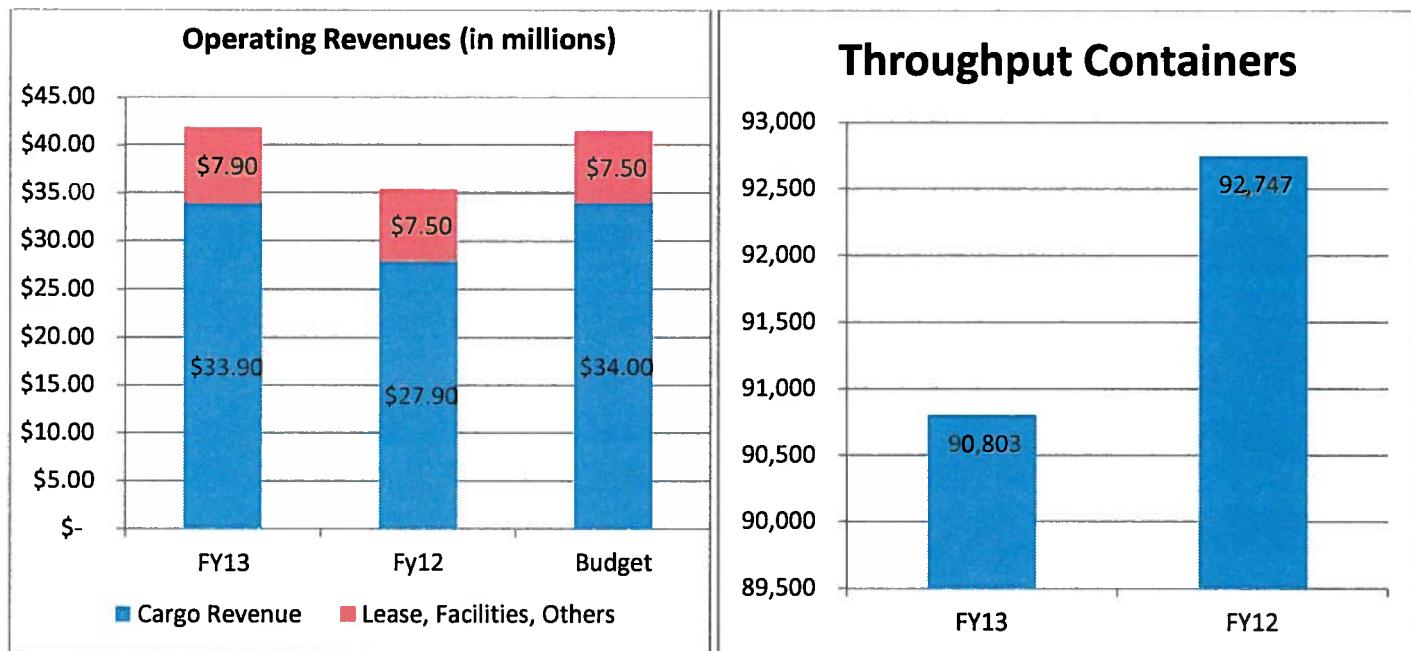

Operating Performance:



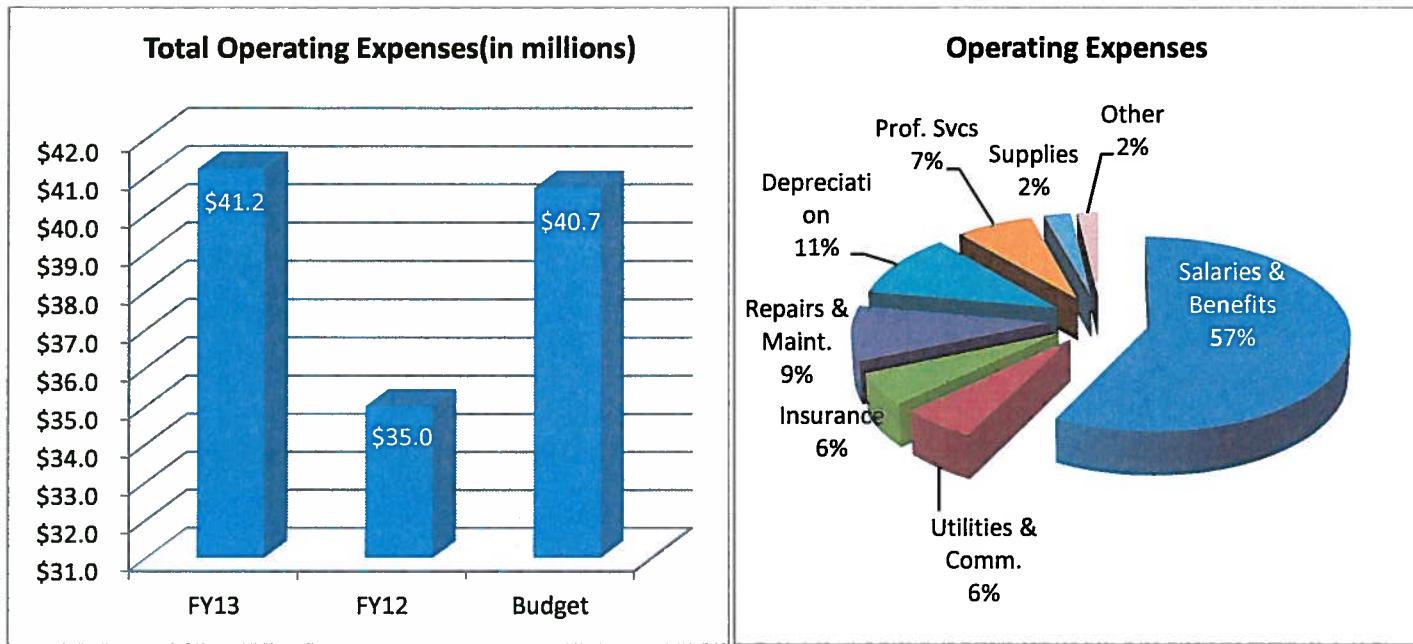
Total Operating Revenues as of September 2013 was \$41.8 million, which consist of \$33.9 million in cargo revenues and \$7.9 million in Facilities, Leases, and Other Services.

FY13 YTD cargo revenue is 22% higher than last year's total (\$27.9 mil) and 0.3% lower than Budget (\$34 mil).

FY13 YTD Facilities, Leases, and Other Services as of September is 6% higher than last year (\$7.5 mil) and 6% higher than budget (\$7.5 mil).

Overall Operating Revenues as of September is 1% higher than Budget (\$41.5 mil) and 18% higher than last year's year to date September (\$35 mil).

Total number of containers handled as of September 2013 was 90,803 which is 2% lower compared to last year September total 92,747.



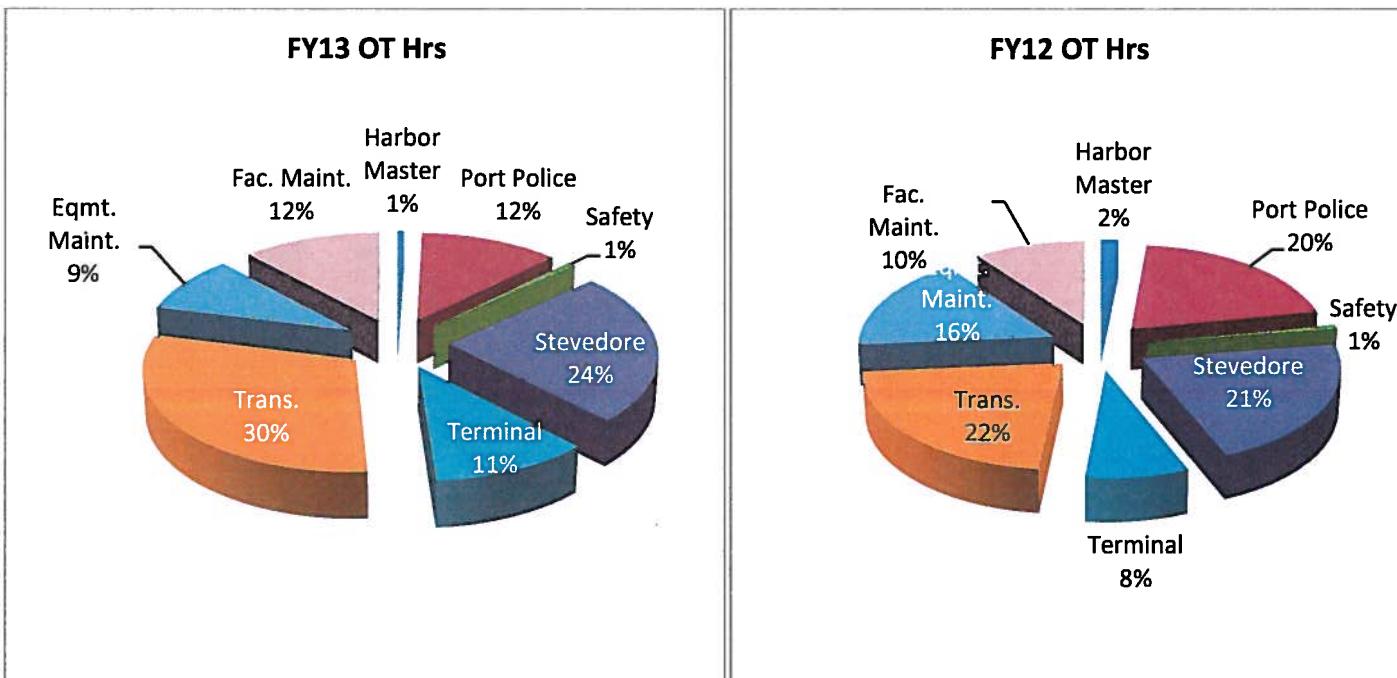
Total Operating Expenses as of September 2013 was \$41.2 million, which is 1% higher than Budget (\$40.7 mil) and 18% higher than last year's total operating expenses (\$35 mil).

Total Overtime as of September 2013 was \$1.3 million which is 100% higher than last year September (\$664k). Direct Labor Revenue as of September was \$2.4m, which is 51% higher than last year and 19% higher than budget. Direct Labor charges are for services performed by Port employees under special service request and differentials under the throughput.

Year to date Operating Revenues minus the Year to date Operating Expenses resulted to an Operating Income of \$632k as of September 30, 2013.

Non Operating Revenues and Expenses consist of the following: \$664k-Loss on Asset Disposal (G2), \$2.2m-Retirement contribution for COLA, Supplemental and Medical/Dental/Life Insurance expenses, \$731k-Interest expense on loans, \$4.7m-Federal Reimbursements and \$201k Interest Income. The net total of non operating expenses and revenues as of September is a negative \$359k.

The Total Net Income as of September is \$272,444 thousand.

Accounts Receivable Trade (net) as of September 30, 2013 is \$8.5 million.

Aging Status is as follows: 60% - Current, 18% - over 30 days, 2% - over 60 days, 1% - over 90 days and 19% - over 120 days.

Accounts Payable Trade as of September 30, 2013 is \$2.5 million which is 38% higher than last month ending balance of \$1.8 million.

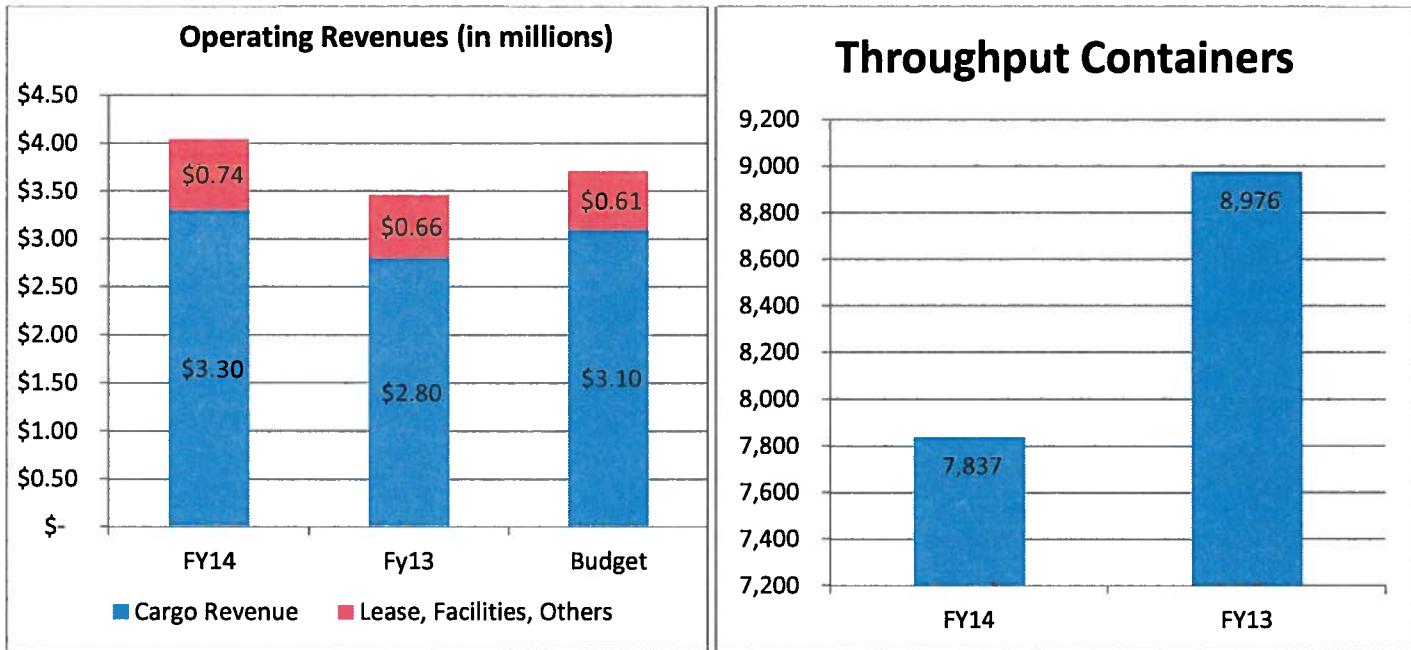

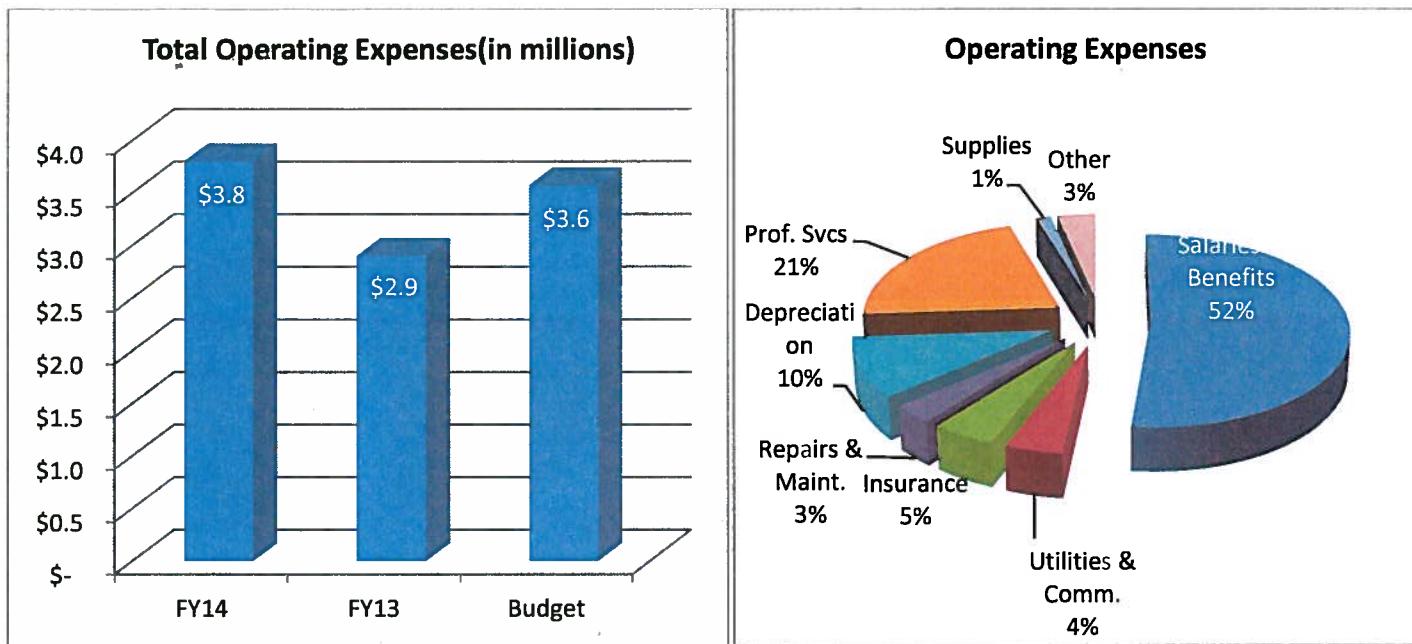
Total Operating Revenues as of October 2013 was \$4 million, which consist of \$3.3 million in cargo revenues and \$735 thousand in Facilities, Leases, and Other Services.

FY14 YTD cargo revenue is 19% higher than last year's total (\$2.8mil) and 8% higher than Budget (\$3.1 mil).

FY14 YTD Facilities, Leases, and Other Services as of October is 11% higher than last year (\$661 thousand) and 21% higher than budget (\$606 thousand).

Overall Operating Revenues as of October is 10% higher than Budget (\$3.7 mil) and 17% higher than last year's year to date October (\$3.5 mil).

Total number of containers handled as of October 2013 was 7,837 which is 12% lower compared to last year October total 8,976.



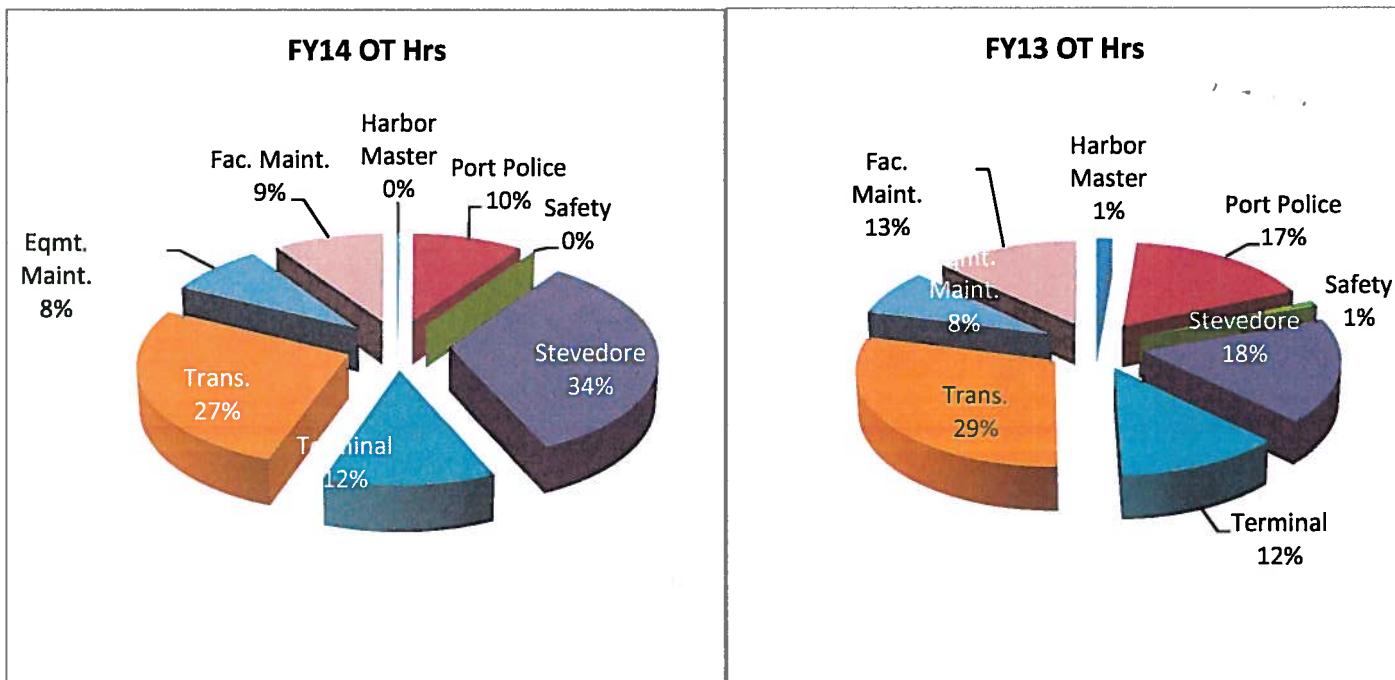
Total Operating Expenses as of October 2013 was \$3.8 million, which is 6% higher than Budget (\$3.57 mil) and 30% higher than last year's total operating expenses (\$2.9 mil).

Total Overtime as of October 2013 was \$150 thousand which is 44% higher than last year October (\$104k). Direct Labor Revenue as of October was \$245 thousand, which is 13% higher than last year and 15% higher than budget. Direct Labor charges are for services performed by Port employees under special service request and differentials under the throughput.

**AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 5404 TO ARTICLE 8,
CHAPTER 5 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED,

DISPOSAL OF EXCESS OR SURPLUS SUPPLIES AND
EQUIPMENT THAT ARE THE PROPERTY OF THE
JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO PORT AUTHORITY OF
GUAM (PAG).**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guāhan* finds
3 that the Port Authority of Guam procures supplies and equipment using revenues
4 generated from rates and tariffs charged to its customers/ratepayers, and *not* from

1 the government of Guam General Fund. When these supplies and equipment
2 become excess or surplus, the disposal thereof is conducted in accordance with
3 Guam Procurement law and regulations. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that
4 an objective of the government of Guam supply management program is to obtain
5 a fair return of value upon disposal of surplus or excess supplies and equipment.

6 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that net proceeds from the disposal of
7 surplus supplies and equipment are credited to the General Fund, in accordance
8 with Guam Procurement law *unless* otherwise exempted. It is the intent of *I*
9 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* to credit the net proceeds from the disposal of PAG surplus
10 supplies and equipment back to PAG for the purpose of supplementing its
11 operations and maintenance budget.

12 **Section 2.** A new §5404 is hereby *added* to Article 8, Chapter 5 of Title 5,
13 Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

14 **“§ 5404. Disposal of Excess Supplies and Surplus Equipment**
15 **by the Port Authority of Guam.** Notwithstanding the provisions of §5403
16 (Allocation of Proceeds from Sale or Disposal of Surplus Supplies), when
17 the Port Authority of Guam engages in disposing of excess or surplus
18 supplies and equipment that were purchased with funds generated from
19 rates, tariffs, or other sources of the Port Authority of Guam and *not* from
20 the General Fund, ninety percent (90%) of the total proceeds from the sale,
21 lease or disposal *shall* revert to the Port Authority of Guam and the
22 remaining ten percent (10%) of the total proceeds *shall* be deposited into the
23 Guam Procurement Advisory Council Support Fund, and *shall* be
24 administered in accordance with §5906 of this Chapter. The Port Authority
25 of Guam *shall not* transfer, sell, trade-in, or otherwise dispose of supplies
26 and equipment owned by the Port Authority of Guam without the
27 authorization of the Port Authority’s Board of Directors.”

1 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* become effective upon
2 enactment.

3 **Section 4. Severability.** *If* any of the provisions of this law or its
4 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law,
5 such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law which
6 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the
7 provisions of this law are severable.

A. Project Description: The existing Gregorio D. Perez Marina is undergoing renovation that consist of driving new sister piles in front of existing piles and provide new concrete jacket and bulkhead. Including new railings.

B. The water quality permit extended to Port Authority of Guam for the construction of Gregorio D. Perez Marina Renovation and Site Improvement, Phase II program specifically requires the Phase III program to include the retrofitting of the existing oil-water separator with local filtered water percolation to comply with the current stormwater discharge regulation. Current surface stormwater runoff at Gregorio D. Perez Marina north pier is polluting the marina basin, the future construction of Phase 3 marina renovation shall be repackage to include provisions to comply with the Clean Water Act Amendments of 1987.

C. Scope of Services:

Thank you for the submission of your initial fee proposal that was based on the Port Planning and Engineering Division scope of work. After the recent completion of Phase II the Port was left with some excess funds that needed reprogramming to other projects. However, before doing so, it was necessary to set aside funding for the repackaging of Phase III, that would enable the Port to make necessary improvements such as the installation of oil water separators, paving north of the marina, upgrades to the electrical/lighting system, upgrades to the bathroom facilities and the design of an open concrete structure to replace the existing canopies in front of the marina that welcomes off island visitors. In addition, the repackaging of Phase III, would ensure that the bid documents will be in compliance with the latest environmental requirements, to address any permitting issues that may surface.

Executive Summary

**Request for Proposal PAG-013-002
A/E Design Consulting Service**

PURPOSE:

Request the Board of Directors to approve the contract award to AM Orient, Engineering, pursuant to the above RFP.

BACKGROUND:

On July 19, 2013 the Port Authority of Guam issued and Request for Proposal for the A/E Design Consulting Service for the Port. Twelve (12) firms expressed interest in the project by purchasing the RFP packet. Seven (7) firms responded with the submittal of their proposals on August 8, 2013. An Evaluation Committee, selected by the General Manager, reviewed all proposals and as a result of their evaluation, AM Orient Engineering was selected as the most qualified and highest ranked offeror.

A Fee Proposal was received by the Port Authority on October 17, 2013. The Negotiation Committee selected by the General Manager met internally on November 5, 2013 to discuss AM Orient's Fee Proposal. Meetings were schedule earlier with AM Orient, however due to the storm conditions at the time and the unavailability of participants, the meetings were rescheduled twice. A counter proposal was forwarded to AM Orient Engineering on November 5, 2013. AM Orient Engineering responded to PAG's counter to the fee proposal. A meeting was held with AM Orient Engineering to discuss their response to PAG's counter on November 21, 2013. A Revised Fee Proposal was submitted by AM Orient Engineering immediately after the meeting, reflecting the acknowledgement of the mutually agreed upon and acceptable fee. The Committee, therefore, successfully completed the cost negotiations and has determined the fees to be fair and reasonable. A copy of the Record of Negotiations is attached for your reference.

LEGAL REVIEW:

A draft contract will be forwarded to the legal counsel for review and approval as to form. Upon completion of this review, the contract form will be executed by both parties and Notice to Proceed will be issued to AM Orient Engineering.

FINANCIAL REVIEW:

Funding for this service is through the approved Capital Improvement Project Budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

Management requests the Board of Directors' motion to approve the award for the A/E Design Consulting Service contract in the amount of \$182,000.00, to AM Orient Engineering for the implementation of Task Order No. 1 as required by the RFP. AM Orient Engineering has been deemed to have met all the requirements set forth in the RFP and is consistent with the Guam Procurement Regulations.

As a result of the RFP evaluation process, the Port Authority of Guam (PAG) solicited cost proposal from **AM Orient** who was selected as the highest ranked proposer to provide for the A/E Design Consulting Services. The established Cost Negotiation committee (Team) consisted of the following:

- Simeon Delos Santos
- Richard Quiambao
- Dora C. Perez

On October 17, 2013, the PAG's Cost Negotiation Committee initially received a proposed fee for Task Order No. 1 (attachment No. 1). The initial fee proposal from AM Orient was \$264,743.75. The negotiation committee members met on November 5, 2013 to review the initial submittal and reduced the amount to \$148,017.11 (attachment 2), a reduction of the proposed fee by 42%. The PAG provided the counter proposal to AM Orient on November 5, 2013.

AM Orient responded to PAG's counter proposal on November 21, 2013 proposing a 26% reduction from the original proposal which resulted in the amount of \$182,000.00 (attachment 3). The committee convened and met with AM Orient on November 21, 2013 to discuss their second submittal. Representing AM Orient were Fred Schmidt, Contracts Administrator and Cozette Villena.

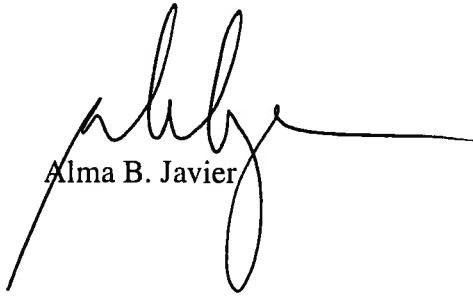
After the discussion on the second proposal, the Negotiation committee and upon mutual agreement with AM Orient, has determined the negotiated fees for Task Order No. 1 as fair and reasonable; therefore recommends the following:

- The amount of \$182,000.00 for Task Order No. 1 which consist of the improvements of
 - 1) Lower Tower,
 - 2) High Tower and
 - 3) CFS

- AM Orient will provide 6 sets of Design and Technical Specification package

The Negotiation Committee therefore recommends the approval of the fee agreed upon on November 21, 2013 for Task Order No. 1. The Scope of Services required in the RFP will be administered through Task Orders (attachment 4). Any Subsequent Task Orders shall be agreed upon by both parties. The contract term will be a period of one (1) year with the option to renew annually for up to four years but not to exceed the total contract term of five (5) years.

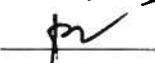

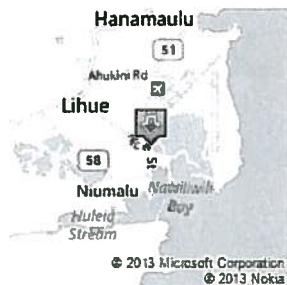
