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MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS Thursday, April 24, 2014

I. CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, the regular meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 11:45 a.m., Thursday, April 24, 2014. Present at the meeting were:

Absent was Mr. Timothy Kernaghan, Board member. Also present were Office of Senator Tom Ada-William Brennan; KUAM-Ken Quintanilla; Marianas Variety-Jasmine Stole and Port Management staff.

Before moving forward with the agenda, Ms. Gibson requested to raise all action items and table the remaining items until the next Board meeting. She expressed concern that a quorum may be defeated once she excuses herself from the meeting to attend a prior engagement. Legal Counsel pointed out that a quorum is not necessarily defeated upon the absence of a Board member, but rather, there would not be a replacement for a third vote if needed. He mentioned that based on Masons or Roberts Rules of Order, generally a quorum is not defeated when a director excuses themselves from the meeting. Legal Counsel opined the meeting can still continue without the presence of director Gibson; however, noted that no action items can be entertained. The Vice Chairperson asked whether a motion is necessary. Legal Counsel replied negatively.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. <u>March 27, 2014 – Regular Board Meeting</u>: Ms. Gibson made motion to approve the minutes of March 27, 2014 subject to correction. The motion was seconded by the Vice Chairperson and was unanimously passed.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT

- a. **Public Comment:** None.
- b. **Employee Comment:** None.
- c. <u>PAGGMA Association</u>: Mr. Raymond B. Santos, President said next month is the American Cancer Society Relay for Life and the government of Guam has rallied together as a team to support this worthy cause. PAGGMA association is supporting the cause through fundraising activities. The Relay for Life event will be held on May 23, 2014.

Agenda Modification for Actionable Items

At this time, the Vice Chairperson made motion to entertain actionable items indicated on the agenda; thereafter, informational report items can then be addressed, seconded by Ms. Gibson. Motion was unanimously approved.

Actionable Items under Old Business

f. Mobile Harbor Crane: By way of background, the Deputy General Manager of Operations (DGMO) mentioned that the Mobile Harbor Crane was purchased as an interim crane back in 2007 for purposes of the impending military buildup. While the crane has the ability to lift and move cargo becomes inoperable on a regular basis. The Port has expended \$700K in repairs and maintenance of the crane which far exceeds actual revenues generated in the use of such crane. The DGMO said the crane has not been in operation since mid-part of last year and request authorization to survey the crane. The Vice Chairperson mentioned that if the equipment has been sitting idle for such a long time depreciating in value would be prudent to remove the crane off of port inventory. She said the Port has the capacity with the POLA cranes to support cargo operations. The Vice Chairperson agrees the crane should be surveyed working alongside the General Services Agency (GSA) through the bidding process, that way any income generated from the sale, the Port will receive 90% of those proceeds pursuant to Public Law 32-081 and be able to invest back into more vital equipment needed for operations.

Ms. Gibson made motion to allow management to survey the Mobile Harbor Crane to the General Services Agency (GSA), seconded by the Vice Chairperson. Motion was unanimously approved.

Actionable items under New Business

1. <u>Fiscal Year 2014 – Mid-Year Budget</u>: Mrs. Maria D.R. Taitano, Deputy General Manager of Admin/Finance (DGMA) mentioned that the Finance team met with the Board in separate meetings to review the proposed fiscal year 2014 mid-year budget where changes and adjustment were made, however, there is still an outstanding issue relating to the overtime budget. The DGMA said while further discussions in how best to control overtime expense will be addressed latter part of this month looking in the areas of scheduling scenarios

and possibility of hiring casual employees as guided by the personnel rules and regulations, she requested for Board's approval of the Fiscal Year 2014 Mid-Year Budget as presented to allow for filling critical positions and to proceed with capital improvement projects. The DGMA mentioned that management will provide a status report on the overtime budget to the Board. The Vice Chairperson said aside from the overtime budget, she has no issues with the mid-year budget as presented. Ms. Gibson commented that she is more inclined to approving the mid-year budget as a whole rather than on a piecemeal basis to demonstrate to the port employees that the Board and management is working proactively in providing overtime that is earned and deserved. Ms. Gibson asked that this item be deferred to the next Board meeting where at that point there will be a complete mid-year budget to be considered. The General Manager said there needs to be some clarification, as it is the Board that requested for a mid-year budget and management has been responsive to request for meetings and addressing concerns of the Board. She pointed out that this will be the second month that the mid-year budget has been delayed. The Vice Chairperson asked whether management can continue to operate using the current budget. The General Manager replied that needs to be clarified by the Board because there are critical items and projects management would like to proceed with; otherwise management will continue using the original budget as approved. The General Manager asked whether the overtime budget is that critical to the point where it holds up the movement of other budget items and projects. Ms. Gibson expressed concern that the Board has yet to see any cost containment or austerity measures put into place. The DGMO mentioned that he is working with Finance and Operations on those issues and will provide a plan of action at the meeting scheduled latter part of this month. In the meantime, he requested for director Gibson to reconsider her position. Ms. Gibson reconsidered only for reasons due to the critical need to fill in the positions relating to security and marine traffic controller.

The Vice Chairperson made motion to approve the Fiscal Year 2014 Mid-Year Budget as presented subject to further review of the overtime budget, seconded by Ms. Gibson. Motion was unanimously approved.

- 2. **Procurement Contract:** Mrs. Alma B. Javier, Procurement Manager reminded the Board that the Risk Management services was presented to the Board at its February 17, 2014 meeting, seeking approval for the first year option renewal, however, it did not garner sufficient votes for passage. Mrs. Javier mentioned that such services expires next month and requests for Board's reconsideration. The Vice Chairperson recalled that management was to provide a report to the Board detailing what risk management services the consultant provides. Mrs. Javier said the Port's risk management consultant is Mr. Mike Moody, IRIS, Ltd. that provides the following:
 - technical expertise in the review of insurance policies
 - performs risk assessment and vulnerability on Port exposures
 - provides risk mitigation recommendation for Port consideration
 - compiles database of all port claims
 - dialogues with claims insurance adjustor serving in the best interest of the Port
 - conducts research on insurance requirements in comparison to other ports

The Vice Chairperson made motion to approve the first year option renewal of four years for IRIS, Ltd. in providing the risk management services, seconded by Ms. Gibson. In calling for the votes, all those who voted in favor of the motion were the Chairman and the Vice Chairperson. Director Gibson opposed. There being no majority of votes obtained for this motion, the motion on the floor failed.

4. <u>Amendment to Bylaws</u>: The Vice Chairperson made motion to amend the Bylaws to indicate that the regular monthly meeting, date and time, shall be determined by the sitting Board and that public notice is issued accordingly. Motion was seconded by Ms. Gibson and was unanimously approved.

6. <u>Travel Authorization</u>:

- a. <u>Department of Homeland Security, Improvise Explosive Device</u>
 <u>Course, May 5-8, 2014, New Mexico</u>: The Vice Chairperson made motion to authorize travel for port personnel to attend the Department of Homeland Security, Improvise Explosive Device Course scheduled for May 5-8, 2014 in New Mexico. Motion was seconded by Ms. Gibson and was unanimously approved.
- 3. <u>OAE Technical Services</u>: Ms. Gibson asked that management explore the need for technical services that can be subsidized or supported by Port's federal partners, more specifically the Office of Economic Adjustment, for funding support to either continue the Port's existing owner/agent engineer or establish a relationship with another party through at least the next 18 to 24 months as the Port proceeds with its port modernization expansion efforts or capital improvement projects where appropriate. Ms. Gibson said she will provide management with a request for proposal for review and consideration.

At this time, the Board members proceeded with the remaining items on the agenda.

IV. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The General Manager's report was provided for Board's information. Following key items were noted as follows:

1. Veto Request for Substitute Bill No. 283-32: Management relayed Port concerns on Substitute Bill No. 283-32 relating to the Master Plan Update 2013 Report in that the bill contains changes from the original version without consultation from the Port. Key points expressed were how the substitute bill impacts the ability of the Board and management to determine priority for the expenditures of its revenue and statutorily limits the Port's autonomy in developing policy and directing overall capital improvements for the Port; places constraints on the ability of the Board and management to administer port projects and fund other capital improvement projects deemed necessary; sets a priority listing in the use of capital improvement funds that impacts the ability to address responsible and routine maintenance/improvements at the Hagatna and Agat marinas; impacts current projects related to the Harbor of Refuge; and presents an administrative intrusion on executive authority short of imminent public safety issues or natural disasters. The General Manager said the letter to the Governor is a request to veto the

substitute bill and hopefully work towards a modified version agreeable to the Port without infringing on its executive authorities already empowered by this Board. A copy of the letter was provided to the Board for their reference.

- 2. <u>USDA \$2M Loan</u>: On March 31, 2014, the Port sent a letter to USDA confirming the Port's continued interest in the \$2M community facility loan and requested that the loan be reprogrammed to secure the acquisition of cargo handling equipment needed for port operations. Management is awaiting USDA response.
- 3. <u>Status of Generator Procurement:</u> The Port received approval from Department of Homeland Security FEMA program with respect to the grant funding, and is moving forward in coordination with GSA to pursue federal GSA in acquiring the generators. Anticipated delivery date of the generators is 105 days.
- 4. <u>Mobile X-Ray Screening Machine</u>: The Port received notice that the lowest bidder for the Mobile Screening System was over \$2M which exceeds the funding allocated for the purchase of the screening equipment. The Port is in the process of making a formal request to GSA to determine if it can procure the system through federal GSA.
- 5. **Procurement Power Line Replacement for LC-3:** GSA awarded G4S the procurement of the underground power line for LC-3 that provides service to the CFS building and High Tower. The power lines are expected to arrive tomorrow with installation by next week.
- 6. <u>Marine Service Life Extension Wharf Repair Project</u>: A bid announcement has been published through print media for interested bidders in the wharf repair project of F5 pier. Deadline to submit proposals are next month.

7. <u>Public Utilities Commission (PUC) Matters:</u>

- PAG Docket 14-03 Port Agreement with Tristar Terminals Guam, Inc. PUC hearing took place on March 31, 2014 where the PUC Board approved the F-1 Fuel Pier Facility Management and Operations Agreement.
- PUC will hold a hearing this evening to address the PMC Contract for Marine Technical Services.
- New Fee Structure for Water and Landside Activities the Port provided public notice on its intent to petition PUC for a new fee structure of water and landside activities conducted on port properties. The purpose of the proposed fee is for cost recovery for administrative processing, staff monitoring, control and maintenance of those port facilities.
- 8. <u>Hanson Permanente Cement Claim</u>: The Port received several letters from Atty. David Ledger, representing Hanson Permanente Cement claiming that an IP&E pipeline is being constructed on what the company considers property under its lease. A claim has since been filed by Hanson with the Attorney General's office against the Port under the Government

Claims Act in the amount of \$58K plus. This matter is currently under review by Legal Counsel and Commercial division.

9. <u>Service Life Extension (SLE) Loan \$10 Million</u>: On Thursday, April 3, 2014 a signing ceremony was held for the closing of the \$10M commercial loan agreement with Bank of Guam. The loan will fund the marine service life extension wharf repair project, upgrade of the Port's financial management system and purchase cargo handling equipment.

At this time of 12:45 p.m., Ms. Gibson was excused from the meeting to attend a previous engagement.

Improvement Program (GCPIP): On Monday, April 14, 2014, the Port held a Ground Breaking Ceremony for the facility expansion construction project. Phase III expansion initiates the largest phase of the \$50M GCPI program that includes a new 4.6 acre container yard, 3.7 acre gate complex, a new domestic water and fire distribution system, a new electrical load center, high mast lighting, storm water sewer system and outfall, oil water separator and wash rack facility. Phase III is scheduled to be completed by the third quarter of 2015.

- e. <u>Rubber Tired Gantry</u>: As the rubber tired gantry asset has been returned back to the Port by GSA, management will be working with representatives of the Maritime Administration (MARAD) and the contractor to address the removal of such equipment.
- g. Guam YTK Corporation: Legal Counsel said the opinion of the Supreme Court was for the parties to proceed with arbitration. There is no ruling on the validity of the underline lease agreement. He reminded the members of the issues surrounding this case in that the Port could not enter into an agreement without legislative approval beyond five years; Guam YTK's failure to pay rent to include others. Legal Counsel opined that the Port had clearly, on two occasions, sufficiently terminated the lease if there actually was one in existence. He said the lower court ruled in the Port's favor, but the Supreme Court overturned the lower courts' ruling and remanded the matter back to the Superior Court to issue an opinion consistent with the Supreme Court's ruling to proceed with arbitration under the arbitration clause. He said the arbitrator will be selected by the parties. Legal Counsel mentioned that until such time the Superior Court notices the parties, the arbitration process can commence. The Chairman asked whether the arbitration process will impact hotel wharf. Legal Counsel replied that hotel wharf

is not affected, and said the arbitration is a request for damages and not a request for use of the underline property. He said hotel wharf is exclusively the property of the Port Authority.

With respect to hotel wharf, the Vice Chairperson mentioned that management may want to look into the new tax credit that may provide additional funding support on the rehabilitation of hotel wharf. She suggested for management to schedule a meeting for purposes of discussion and information to determine whether this would be advantageous for the Port to pursue.

Green Ridge Spider Infestation

On Thursday, May 1, 2014, the vessel Green Ridge arrived dockside at the Port of Guam. The vessel was boarded and cleared by Customs and Quarantine and a Vessel Safety Inspection was conducted by Safety Inspector John T. Santos prior to Port employees entering the vessel to begin discharging cargo.

Safety Inspector Santos relayed that around 8:15 p.m. that evening Supervisor II Joe Quintanilla reported to the Safety Division that unknown spiders had been discovered on the vessel while the Stevedores were unlashing the cargo. The Safety Division notified Customs and Port personnel were disembarked from the vessel. Customs Officers and Safety Inspector Santos re-boarded the vessel and conducted another inspection. Customs retrieved samples of the spiders, noted that soil was also found on the vessel and ordered that the Green Ridge be sent out to anchor. Representatives from Ambyth, agent for the Green Ridge and Port management were notified of the situation.

A determination was provided by UOG, as Dr. Russell Campbell, Entomologist, from the Department Agriculture was off-island, that the spider samples were black widow spiders. Ambyth hired Pestex to address the treatment of the spiders that were believed to be located on certain sections of the vessel. On Friday, May 2, 2014, Customs authorized the vessel to be returned to the Port to address treatment. Once this process was completed, a follow-up inspection was conducted and clearance was provided for the Port to re-board the vessel. Port Stevedores once again began the process of removing the cargo and unloaded about eight units before spiders were once again discovered on the vessel. Port employees were notified to disembark the vessel.

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On Saturday, May 3, 2014, Director of Customs Pedro Leon Guerrero, Department of Agriculture Deputy Matt Sablan and the Port GM met to confer on the recommended action as two previous inspections had cleared the vessel and yet black widow spiders were still present. Customs Director Leon Guerrero requested an additional 12-14 Customs Officers and Customs Biosecurity Officers to board the vessel for additional inspections. The determination was made to individually examine each vehicle, equipment, or container on the Green Ridge and spot treat each piece prior to discharge. The Green Ridge cargo primarily consisted of vehicles, heavy equipment and containers. Port employees were provided a safety briefing by Pestex and respond to safety questions and concerns raised by the Port crew assigned on duty.

On Sunday, May 4, 2014, the process of individually inspecting each piece of cargo and spot treating continued. During inspection, snails were found on one container. This container was sealed until a determination could be made as to the appropriate treatment process to eradicate the snails. After this matter was reviewed by Customs and Quarantine and Agriculture a decision was made to fumigate the container before it was released.

On Sunday evening, May 4, 2014, the final cargo was removed from Green Ridge and the vessel departed on Monday, May 5, 2014.

The Port has received four reports since the departure of the Green Ridge that was forwarded through the appropriate channels. The first report was filed on Friday, May 9, 2014; the second report was filed on Tuesday, May 13, 2014; the third report was filed on Friday, May 16, 2014; and the fourth report was filed on Monday, May 19, 2014, In all four cases, Dr. Russell Campbell determined that the reported spiders were orb weaver spiders commonly found on Guam and not black widow spiders.

The Port has responded to every official notification from its employees concerning spiders since the recent visit of the Green Ridge. The Port has forwarded this information to Customs & Quarantine and the Department of Agriculture for official determination and action. Other than unknown allegations there is no evidence that has been verified of black widow spiders within the Port Yard since the departure of the Green Ridge.

On Wednesday, May 7, 2014, the GM called a meeting with Customs & Quarantine and the Department of Agriculture to discuss the concerns that had been raised as a result of the Green Ridge incident. Attending the meeting on behalf of the Port were the GM, Deputy GM for Operations, and Operations Manager John Santos. Present on behalf of Customs and Quarantine were Director Pedro Leon Guerrero, Major Vincent Perez, Lt. Glenn Paulino, and Officer II Jason Paulino. Present on behalf of the Department of Agriculture were Director Tita Taitague, Deputy Director Matt Sablan, Dr. Russell Campbell, and Mr. Joe Mafnas. Present on behalf of UOG were Extension Biosecurity Representative Roland Quitugua and Northern Guam Soil &

Water Conservation Assistant Alison Hadley. Also present from the PDN was reporter Dance Aoki.

Customs provided a presentation and timeline on the events related to the arrival and inspections of the Green Ridge. General discussion was focused on how to build upon existing protocols and update contact listings between Customs, Agriculture, Agents and the Port. Customs agreed to meet with the Port and the PUGG during its next meeting on Thursday, May 15, 2014 to meet with the Port carriers.

Veto of Bill No. 283-32

On Monday, April 28, 2014, Governor Eddie Calvo vetoed Bill No. 283-32 "An Act to Approve and Adopt the Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) Schedule, Strategic Recommendations, and Land Use Designations in the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port of Guam Master Plan Update 2013 Report."

The Governor informed Speaker Judy Won Pat that Bill No. 283-32 sets higher and lower priorities, distinguishing between Port Cargo Terminal and Marine Industrial Terminal facilities and public harbors, small boat marinas, Hotel Wharf and the Harbor of Refuge "By dictating the priority and conditions of the Port's expenditures, violates the Organic Act of Guam and encroaches upon the autonomous power granted to the Port's Board of Directors to control and manage its facilities. The revenues generated by the Port belong to the Port, and are not general fund appropriations subject to the Legislature's control." The Governor went on to cite several court cases to include a Guam Supreme Court ruling that ". . . the activity of spending is essentially an executive task." He also referenced the 2002 Case involving Governor Gutierrez that determined that the legislature was not permitted to set limitations or conditions which "purport to reserve the legislature powers of close supervision that are essentially executive in character."

The Governor vetoed Bill No. 283-32 on Thursday, April 24. 2014.

Introduction of Bill No. 328-32 to Approve Master Plan Update 2013 Report

On Thursday, May 1, 2014, Senator Tom Ada introduced Bill No. 328-32," An Act to Approve and Adopt the CIP Schedule and Land Use Designations in the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port of Guam Master Plan Update 2013 Report. Bill No. 328-32 would approve the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) schedule for (Table 5-1 :CIP Schedule, page 5-10 of the MPU 2 013) in the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Master Plan Update (MPU) 2013 Report with the following recommendations:

- 1. the Legislature recommends the Port focus near term on the definition and priorities for its Sustainability Projects and the To Be Scheduled sustainability projects, and to include Berth F-1, G-Pier, and H-Wharf as critical to preserving marine industrial capabilities in the CIP Schedule.
- 2. Port investments and the supporting tariff adjustments related to this approved CIP Schedule are subject to 12 GCA Chapter 12 (Public Utilities Commission and the Telecommunications Act of 2004) and the debt ceiling limit established by P.L. 30-57.

Section 2. Approval and Adoption of the Commercial Port and Vicinity Land Use Designation. The Commercial Port and Vicinity Land Use Designation (Figure 2-3, Page 2-10, MPU 2013) in the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Master Plan Update (MPU) 2013 Report is hereby approved and adopted.

Section 3. MPU 2013 Report Supersedes and Complements. The MPU 2013 supersedes and complements the previously approved MPU 2007 Report. As such it supports facility improvement projects thus far accomplished or currently underway and the land use designations.

Public Law 32-155

On Wednesday, May 21, 2014, Acting Governor of Guam Raymond Tenorio signed Bill No. 328-32 (COR) "An Act to Approve and Adopt the Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) Schedule and Land Use Designations in the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port of Guam Master Plan Update 2013 Report. Bill No. 328-32 (COR) was passed by the Guam Legislature on Friday, May 9, 2014.

PUC Approval of Crane Contract

On Thursday, April 24, 2014, The Public Utilities Commission (PUC) held a regular business meeting to address PAG Docket 14-04, Petition for Contract Review of PMC Contract with Marine Technical Services, ALJ Report and Proposed Order.

Attending this meeting on behalf of the Port was the GM, Deputy GM for Finance and Administration, Deputy GM for Operations, Procurement and Supply Manager Alma Javier, Maintenance Manager Ernie Candoleta, and Accountant III Richard Quiambao.

The PUC Commissioners ordered that after their review of the ALJ Report that the PAG is authorized to enter into the PMC contract with Marine Technical services, Inc. for an estimated cost of \$1,020,000.00

Superior Court Ruling on Civil Service Commission Action

On Friday, May 16, 2014, Superior Court of Guam Judge James Canto issued his ruling on the Civil Service Action that Port management did not follow proper procedures in the termination of former employees Accountant II Kevin Susuico and Accountant II Salvador Guevera. The Port had requested a Post-Audit Investigation on the recruitment of Port employees back on May 10, 2012. The Civil Service Commission (CSC) issued a Staff Investigation that determined that Mr. Susuico and Mr. Guevera did not meet the minimum requirements to be hired for their respective positions. The CSC determined that in the case of Mr. Susuico and Mr. Guevera that as they had not been properly hired though the merit system, their employment with the Port was null and void.

As a result of the CSC ruling, Port management terminated the employment of these two employees. Mr. Susuico and Mr. Guevera then appealed their termination to the CSC. On July 30, 2013, the CSC determined that it had jurisdiction to hear the appeal of the two employees and that the Port had violated the 60 day rule to address adverse action against them. The CSC then ordered the Port to reinstate the two employees to their previous positions as Accountants.

The Port filed a Petition for Judicial Review appealing the CSC decision on August 29, 2013 to the Superior Court of Guam. The Port argued that the CSC had exceeded its statutory authority when it made the decision to reinstate the two employees.

Judge Canto ordered that the Port's Petition for Judicial Review be granted and that the Court vacates the CSC's Decision and Judgment in the Adverse Action Appeal Case No. 13-AA08T and 13AA05T ordered by the CSC for lack of jurisdiction.

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TIGER Grant Submittal for Hotel Wharf

On Friday, April 25, 2014, the Port provided notice to the Administrator for the Guam State-Clearing house that the Port had submitted its FY 2014 National Infrastructure Investment TIGER VI Discretionary Grant Application. The purpose of the application is to address the Maintenance and Repair of Hotel Wharf and Access Road. The grant application was transmitted by the Port's Planning Division to the U.S. Department of Transportation prior to the Monday, April 28, 2014 deadline.

Turnover of Selected Demolition and Break Bulk Yard Modifications Project

On Friday, May 2, 2014, The GM received a letter of notification from EA Engineering Construction Manager Zenon Belanger that the work for the Selected Demolition and Break Bulk Yard Modifications Project had been completed as per the plans specified under the contract. He also relayed that the area has been turned over to the Port and can now be used for Port operations. The Port has commenced the use of the area for break bulk cargo since the notice was provided. Deputy GM for Operations and Operations Manager John Santos have both relayed that they are pleased with the final construction quality of the Break Bulk Yard. This section of the Yard was expanded with the demotion of Warehouse II that comprised of over 100,000 square feet in ground area.

Notice to Proceed for the Welded Steel Petroleum Distribution Piping and Appurtenances Project No. GU-PAg-0011(004)

On Friday, May 2, 2014, the Port received notice from DPW Director Carl Dominguez that his department had issued a Notice to Proceed to Rex International, Inc. President Keun Y. Kim for the Welded Steel Petroleum Distribution Piping and Appurtenances Project No. GU-PAg-0011(004). The project was authorized to commence on Monday, May 5, 2014. The contractor has a total of 300 calendar days to complete the project. The Port has been working in coordination with DPW and FHWA on this project for the replacement of the existing pipeline used by Mobil to transfer fuel from Golf Pier.

Boating Infrastructure Grant (BIG) for Harbor of Refuge MOU

On Tuesday, April 29, 2014, the Port received a memorandum from the Department of Agriculture Director Mariquita Taitague on the finalized Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Boating Infrastructure Grant (BIG) Tier 1 Grant for Harbor of Refuge. The purpose of the Tier 1 funding is to address the repair of designated moorings for transient vessels at the Harbor of Refuge. The GM signed the MOU on Wednesday, April 30, 2014. The Port is

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awaiting a copy of the final document once it is signed by the Director of BBMR, the Attorney General, and the Governor.

Notice of Intent to Award for Invitation for Bid IFB No.CIP-0140003 North Side container Yard CMU Wall Upgrade Project Phase I

On Wednesday, May 7, 2014, the Port provided a Notice of Intent to Allied Builders and Construction Representative Hector Quioc for construction work on the Port's North Side Container Yard CMU Wall Upgrade. Allied Builders met the qualifying bid requirements with the lowest bid amount. The Port can provide a Notice of Award once the Board has approved the contract award to the lowest bidder. This matter is before the Board for determination at this meeting.

Notice of Intent to Award for Invitation for Bid IFB No.CIP-014-004 Container Freight Station (CFS) Building Repair Project

On Thursday, May 8, 2014, the Port provided a Notice of Intent to Pro Pacific Builder Corporation Owner Jean Yeon Yu for the Container Freight Station (CFS) Building Repair Project. Pro Pacific Builder Corporation met the qualifying bid requirements with the lowest bid amount. The Port can provide a Notice of Award once the Board has approved the contract award to the lowest bidder. This matter is before the Board for determination at this meeting.

Status of CFS Power Line Repair

Under the Supervision of Electrician Supervisor Kenneth Camacho, the Electrical Section has addressed the removal of the damaged underground power line for the CFS Building and High Tower. G4S last week provided two (2) replacements spools out of the original four (4) procured for power lines that were tested to be deficient to meet both dry and wet conditions. The Port anticipates the replacement of the underground power line this week.

Status of Generator Procurements

According to Port Security Grant Program Manager Joe Javellana the Port requisition for the generators through Federal GSA has been approved by Guam GSA. All Fed GSA vendors' pricing has been submitted to GSA and the Port has received the USDHA/FEMA approval to purchase directly from the Fed GSA Schedule vendors.

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Status of Scanning Equipment Procurement

According to Port Security Grant Program Manager Joe Javellana the Port requisition for the Mobile Screening System Update to purchase directly from FED GSA vendors has been approved by USDHS/FEMA Program Manager. The Port is currently compiling information from FED GSA to provide pricing and other information required by Guam GSA. Mr. Javellana anticipates a submittal of the requested information on (pricing and documentation) to GSA on or before May 30th, 2014.

PUGG Meeting for May

The PUGG meeting was held on Thursday, May 15, 2014. Attending on behalf of the Port were the GM, Deputy GM for Operations, Operations Manager John Santos, Chief Planner Dot Harris Terminal Superintendent Joe Ulloa, Stevedore Superintendent Simon Pinaula, Maintenance Manager Ernie Candoleta, Engineer III Rudel Mangubat, and Safety Adminstrator Frank Roberto.

Attending on behalf of the PUGG were Ambyth Representative Joe Guerrero, Ambyth Representative Velma Santos, Ambyth Representative Greg David, Ambyth Representative Teresa Gotti and Ambyth Representative Emy Reyes, MELL/CTSI Representative Ken Constantino, MSA Representative Tony Reyes, MSA Representative Rolan Comia, Matson Representative Paul Blas, Matson Representative Thomas Dillon.

Attending on behalf of Customs and Quarantine was Director Pedro Leon Guerrero, Major Vincent Perez, Lt. Raymond Blas and Lt. Francis Fejarang.

The primary issue on the agenda was the most recent incident with the black widow spiders on the Green Ridge. Director Leon Guerrero provided a summary of what had occurred and what was the response of Customs to address the incident. He stated that there were additional improvements that could be made to the process but also relayed that there is an expectation that cargo entering the island is clean. However, he added that this has not always been the case. Director Leon Guerrero informed the group that Customs has traditional evaluated and classified cargo according to high and low risk cargo. He stated that Customs has since adjusted its standard operating procedure as there is no absolute way of determining that cargo is clean. He stated that Customs would have an increased presence at the Port and that a greater effort will be put in place facilitate inspections with particular interest to equipment and break bulk cargo that can be transporting soils and other invasive species.

Director Leon Guerrero stated that continued coordination between the Department of Agriculture, the Port and the shipping agents was very important to addressing the type of General Manager's Report Report to the Board of Directors May 28, 2014 Page 9 of 24

situation that occurred with the Green Ridge. He also discussed the recent incident with the Kyowa where a spider was found and operations were briefly suspended until a determination could be made if the spider was a black widow spider or an orb weaver spider. The Department of Agriculture determined that the spider was an orb weaver spider. As soon as this determination was made, the Port was notified by Customs and operations on the Kyowa resumed.

Operations Manager John Santos discussed the importance of following proper protocols and communication among all parties involved to effectively respond to and determine the best way to proceed to address the problem. He relayed that the Port is impacted with safety concerns for its employees and also the loss of productivity when operations are suspended. He emphasized that safety was very important and that proper inspections are needed on board the vessel prior to clearance from Customs.

A representative from Ambyth brought up the questions as to what steps are taken by the military to sanitize cargo prior to the cargo being loaded onto a vessel. The container that required fumigation on the Green Ridge for the invasive snails was military cargo. The GM responded that this certainly is a general concern for all cargo and relayed that the Port also needed the assistance of the carriers to address additional steps for inspection of cargo prior to it being loaded onto their vessels. The GM stated that at the end of the day, everyone takes a loss when invasive species are found on a vessel. For the carrier, there is additional cost for docking space, manpower, treatment cost, liabilities and impact to time schedules for the vessel. The issue of invasive species is a growing problem and additional efforts will need to be put in place to minimize the impact on moving cargo. The GM concluded that this concern should also be further discussed with the military as a substantial amount of cargo imported to the Port of Guam is military cargo destined for military installations on Guam.

Meeting with Army Corps of Engineers on Agat Marina

On Monday, May 12, 2014, the Port management and staff met with Army Corps Project Manager Milton Yoshimoto, and Justin Goo, P.E., from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Honolulu District. Present on behalf of the Port were the GM, Deputy GM for Operations, Chief Planner Dot Harris, Engineer Manager Simeon Delos Santos, Engineer III Rudel Mangubat, Engineer II Enrique Conde, Maintenance Manager Ernie Candoleta, Commercial Manager Glenn Nelson, Building Maintenance Supervisor Ray Munoz, Planner IV Donna Lizama-Acosta, Planner IV Dora Perez and Acting Harbor Master Charlene Yatar.

The meeting was held at the Agat Marina to discuss a technical study to assess shoreline erosion issues at the marina and adjacent areas in Agat for inclusion in the Army Corps Fiscal Year 2015

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budget request. Mr. Yoshimoto verified during the meeting that Army Corps would be responsible for conducting topographical surveys of the area. The findings of the technical assessment will be used to determine further needed actions for future budget requests. Mr. Yoshimoto also relayed that he would update the Port as these issues progressed.

Last year the GM forwarded a letter on October of 2013 to U.S. Army Corp of Engineers District Engineer Lieutenant Colonel Thomas Asbery Request the assistance of the Honolulu District to address the breakwater modification located at the Agat Boat Marina. The Port also requested further studies to determine the sediment impact to the marina and adjacent areas to include Nimitz Beach.

Meeting with DPW Highway Division on the Asan and Aguada Bridges Rehabilitation Project

On Friday, April 25, 2014, the GM met with DPW Highway Administrator Joaquin Blaz to discuss the concerns relayed by the PUGG on traffic restrictions as a result of the rehabilitation work on the Asan and Aguada Bridges. The GM informed Mr. Blaz that the Port, on behalf of the request of the PUGG, was inquiring if an additional lane could be available during the construction project to minimize the backlog in cargo transportation from the Port to the Central and Northern Guam over the Asan Bridge and to the South over the Aguada Bridge. DPW had previously reported that the lanes would be reduced to one lane in each direction during bridge construction. Of particular concern was traversing these bridges from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. from Tuesday through Thursday during the days of the week when cargo loads are higher. The GM relayed that re-routing cargo trucks through Nimitz Hill would be difficult due to the narrowness of certain portions of the roadway and the mountainous climb. The GM requested if a meeting could be scheduled between Port operations staff and DPW's highway staff and consultants to determine if the request was feasible and would not interfere with the rehabilitation of the bridges.

Mr. Blaz responded that he would coordinate a meeting date for the respective staff to discuss and review this matter.

Temporary Change in Terminal Gate House Traffic Routes

On Friday, May 09, 2014, the GM sent a notice to Port Tenants, Carriers, and Truckers informing them that due to the ongoing construction for Phase III a temporary change would be made to the traffic patterns entering and exiting the Terminal Gate House. Black Construction, contractor for Phase III, had requested the change due to intended construction over the existing employee parking immediately adjacent to the Gate House. The change in traffic patterns was

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effective on Saturday, May 10, 2014. All Port Tenants, Carriers and Truckers will be advised as soon as normal gate operations resume. Operations Manager John Santos has been designated as the point of contract for this matter.

Chamber MAC Meeting Participation

On Thursday, May 15, 2014, Operations Manager John Santos attended the Guam Chamber of Commerce Maritime Affairs Committee (MAC) Meeting to provide an update on the status of Port construction and other activities. The MAC Meetings are scheduled by the Chamber on the third Thursday of each month. Mr. Alfred Leon Guerrero currently serves as the Chamber's MAC Chairman.

Rotary Club of Guam Presentation

On Thursday, May 15, 2014, the GM and Planner IV Joe Javellana provided an updated presentation to the Rotary Club of Guam on the status of ongoing Port construction projects. Also in attendance at this meeting were Board Member Kernaghan and former Board Chairman Dan Tydingco.

Port Events

Relay for Life Port Team

On Friday, May 23, 2014, the Port participated in the annual Relay for Life Event that was held at the George Washington High School track field. The time slotted for the Port's participation was from 11:00 p.m. that evening to 12:00 a.m. Saturday morning. Acting General Manager Felix Pangelinan and Port employees were in attendance at this event to show the Port's Strong support to fight cancer. The Port employee's donation to this year's Relay for Life Event was \$2,143.48.

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Route 11 Adopt A Highway Clean Up Project

On Friday, May 13, 2014, the Port received an invitation from Matson Operations Manager Paul Blas to partner with Matson in its quarterly Adopt-A-Highway clean-up project for Route 11 also known as Cabras Highway. Matson has officially adopted Route 11.

The Port maintains the grass trimming for Route 11 and also addresses the trash collection on the roadway when it conducts regular maintenance. However, litter on the side of the roadway is a daily problem.

Matson scheduled two teams to participate in the clean-up project. The first team began its litter collection at the Port Administration building and the second team began the clean-up process at the USO.

The Port participated in the clean-up project from the Administration Building to Family Beach.

Port Safety Issues

Industrial Incident

On Monday, April 28, 2014 the GM received a report dated Thursday, April 24, 2014 from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning an industrial Incident involving Crane Operator Anthony P. Yamasta. According to Mr. Santos, Mr. Yamasta was the operator of Gantry 6 and was assigned to load containers on the Maunalei Vessel. As Mr. Yamasta was loading a 40 ft. container on Bay 18, Cell Guide 4, he had been in the process of hosting the Gantry spreader when the left flapper on the waterside caught the lip of the vessel deck causing damage to the flapper.

Mr. Santos determined that the primary cause of this incident was inattention and complacency on the part of the operator.

The incident has been forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommended action to the General Manager.

Industrial Incident Tractor 88

On Wednesday, April 23, 2014, the GM received a report from Safety Inspector Vince Acfalle concerning Equipment Operator II Raymond San Nicolas who was operating Tractor 88, draying containers from the Matson vessel Mauna Lei at F-5 and notice that both landing gear legs on

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Trailer MATZ 9205546 were bent. Mr. Acfalle relayed that Mr. San Nicolas did not raise his landing gear legs high enough to clear the spur rail tracks.

Mr. San Nicolas informed his Supervisor Joaquin Meno, Port Police and the Safety Office about the incident.

Mr. Acfalle determined that the cause of the incident was failure of operator to raise landing gear legs to clear high spots on crane tracks and that he failed to recognize known problem areas. He further recommended that equipment operators be required to raise their landing gear legs eight to twelve inches from the bottom of legs to the pavement.

The incident has been forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommended action to the General Manager.

Industrial Incident Private Trucker

On April 28, 2014, the GM received a report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas that an incident had occurred with an ISLA Trucker and the spur rail located in the yard. ISLA Driver Johnathan Blas had checked in an empty 40-foot container at the check point. He was directed to proceed to Area "A" to ground the container. While he was traveling to the designated location the right landing leg shoe of his truck struck the spur rail. Mr. Salas relayed that Mr. Blas did not raise the 5th wheel and landing legs high enough to clear the spur rail. The right landing leg shoe of Mr. Blas' truck was damaged with no damage to the spur rail.

Mr. Salas determined that the operator failed to adjust his landing legs for sufficient clearances of high spots on container yard.

The incident has been forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommended action to the General Manager.

Damaged Property - Bollard at 1400

On Monday, May 5, 2014, the GM received a reported dated from Wednesday, April 20, 2014 from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning the damage to the Port Bollard at 1400. According to Mr. Santos the RORO Pamploma was in the process of being berth at F-4 by Tugboat "Chief Quipua" when the starboard side of the Pamploma vessel struck the Bollard at 1400. It was determined that the tugboat was pushing the Pamploma at an angle to the pier that as a result of inertia caused the forward movement of the barge, striking and damaging the bollard. The vessel also sustained damage its starboard side.

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Mr. Santos determined that this accident be investigated by the Port Harbor Master and U.S. Coast Guard for further recommendations.

The incident has been forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommended action to the General Manager.

Work Injury

On Friday, May 9, 2014, the GM received a report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas that on that same day Refrigeration Mechanic II Chris Rodriguez had been injured as a result of a piece to a C-brace that fell and glanced off his left upper arm. Mr. Salas reported that the C-brace was about ten inches long and weighed between 1 to 2 pounds.

This work injury occurred when Mr. Rodriguez was speaking with Cargo Checker Vincent Toves, who was directing a tractor operator at the time, to the location of where the ground reefer plug stations were located. Mr. Rodriguez wanted to insure that that the containers were placed at the designated locations at the reefer plug station. Mr. Rodriguez was standing under Gantry #6 when the C-brace fell from the gantry. Mr. Salas reported that there were signs of rust at the location of the where C-brace fell.

Mr. Rodriguez had no visible injuries but did complain of pain where he had been struck in his upper left arm. He was transported by ambulance to GMH for medical attention and the proper WCC forms 101a, 201 and 202 were issued.

According to Mr. Salas the primary cause of this incident was lack of preventive maintenance on Gantry #6 and Mr. Roriguez's failure to communicate with cargo checker via radio or at Lower Tower Office. Mr. Salas further recommended that all mechanical parts be checked prior to utilizing the gantry.

The incident has been forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommended action to the General Manager.

Industrial Incident Tractor 88

On Friday, May 9, 2014, the GM received a report from Safety Inspector II Paul Salas that Equipment Operator II Raymond San Nicolas had been assigned to dray 40-foot containers for loading on the Mell Springwood. During his second loading Mr. San Nicolas reported that he notice the right side mirror of the tractor was cracked. When he completed his assignment, he turned in the tractor to Preventative Maintenance to repair the housing and replace the side mirror that was shattered.

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Mr. Salas determined that the primary cause of this incident was lack of maintenance to side mirrors on tractors. He recommended that rear view mirrors on all tractors be inspected and properly serviced and maintained.

The incident has been forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommended action to the General Manager.

Legislative Matters

Public Hearing Notice for Bill No. 337-32 on Underground Storage Tanks

On Thursday, May 15, 2014, the Port received a Public Hearing Notice scheduled for Tuesday, May 20, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. concerning Bill No. 337-32 (COR) An Act to Amend §§ 76114, 76116, and 76124 OF Chapter 76, Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, Relative to the Underground Storage Tank Management Fund, Closure, and Associated Penalties.

The Port Planning Division reviewed the bill and recommended that the Port had no position with regards to the bill.

Legislative Certificate Presentation

On Wednesday, May 14, 2014, Senator Chris Duenas and Senator Aline Yamashita presented Legislative Certificate 132-32 (LS) to the Port Authority of Guam employees who detected the black widow spider infestation on the Green Ridge Vessel docked at the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port and acted to quarantine the vessel and alert officials. The two employees recognized that day were Stevedore Supervisor II Joe Quintanilla and Stevedore Rene Topasna. A second presentation will be scheduled for night shift personnel at a later date.

Freedom of Information Act Request

Request from Bernadette Meno

As reported to the Board during its April 24, 2014 Board Meeting, the Port received a FOIA request from Bernadette Meno on April 22, 2014 requesting the following information:

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My FOIA specifically requested copies of official court documents or restraining orders signed by a judge indicating that I am banned from port property. Mike Phillips is not a judge and that is not an official court document.

Because your FOIA response is non-compliant I will again ask under the Freedom of Information Act for copies of the documents which allow you to ban an individual such as myself from public property. If you have no such documents then you must indicate that you do not.

On Monday, April 28, 2014, the Board provided a response to Ms. Meno.

Request from Bernadette Meno

As reported to the Board during its Thursday, April 24, 2014 meeting the Port received a FOIA request from Bernadette Meno on April 22, 2014 requesting the following information:

A copy of the contract with Marine Technical Services which was approved via board Resolution 2014-06.

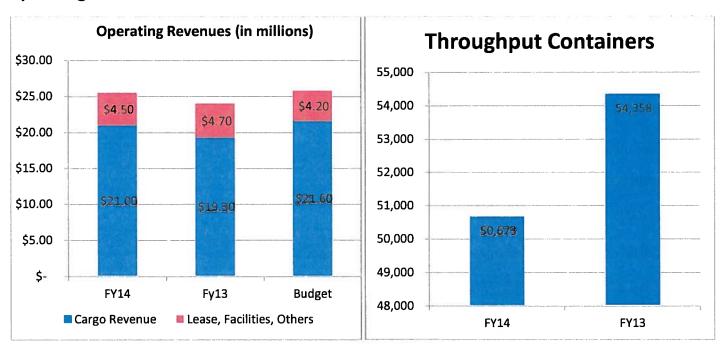

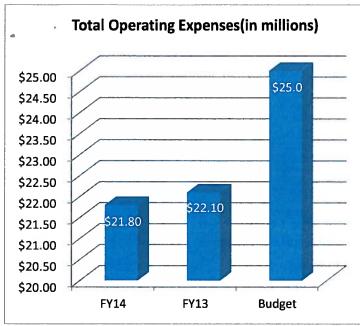
Total Operating Revenues as of April 2014 was \$25.5 million, which consist of \$21 million in cargo revenues and \$4.5 million in Facilities, Leases, and Other Services.

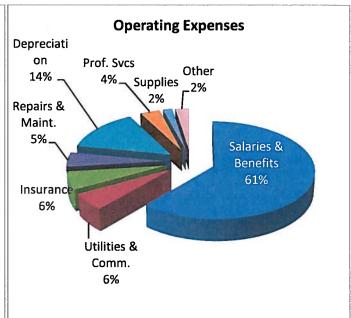
FY14 YTD cargo revenue is 9% higher than last year's total (\$19.3mil) and 3% lower than Budget (\$21.6mil).

FY14 YTD Facilities, Leases, and Other Services as of April is 5% lower than last year (\$4.7 mil) and 5% higher than budget (\$4.2 mil).

Overall Operating Revenues as of April is 1% lower than Budget (\$25.8 mil) and 6% higher than last year's year to date April (\$24 mil).

Total number of containers handled as of April 2014 was 50,673 which is 7% lower compared to last year April total 54,358.





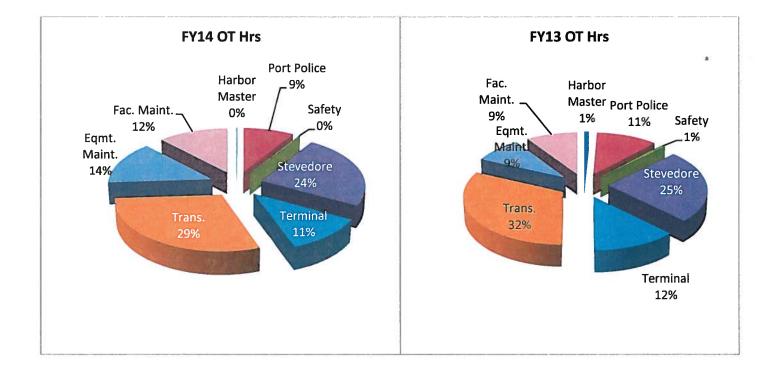
Total Operating Expenses as of April 2014 was \$21.8 million, which is 13% lower than Budget (\$25 mil) and 1% lower than last year's total operating expenses (\$22.1 mil).

Total Overtime as of April 2014 was \$773 thousand which is 3% lower than last year April (\$796k). Direct Labor Revenue as of April was \$1.5 million, which is less than 1% lower than last year and 1% higher than budget. Direct Labor charges are for services performed by Port employees under special service request and differentials under the throughput.

Year to date Operating Revenues minus the Year to date Operating Expenses resulted to an Operating Income of \$3.7 million as of April 30, 2014.

Non Operating Revenues and Expenses consist of the following: \$1.3M-Retirement contribution for COLA, Supplemental and Medical/Dental/Life Insurance expenses, \$510k-Interest expense on loans, \$161k Loss on Asset (survey 3 sidelifters 1998), \$2.2M-Federal Reimbursements and \$345k Interest Income. The net total of non operating expenses and revenues as of April is a positive \$552k.

The Total Net Income as of April is \$4.2 million.

Accounts Receivable Trade (net) as of April 30, 2014 is \$6.3 million.

Aging Status is a follows: 74% - Current, 6% - over 30 days, 1% - over 60 days, 3% - over 90 days and 16% - over 120 days.

Accounts Payable Trade as of April 30, 2014 is \$2.3 million which is 72% higher than last month ending balance of \$1.3 million.

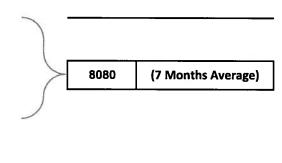

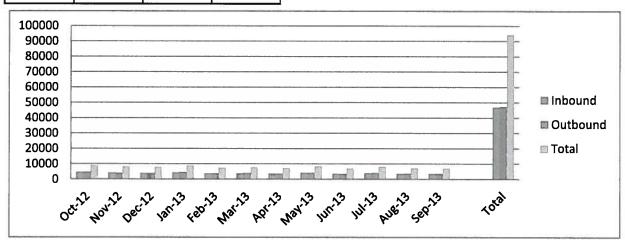

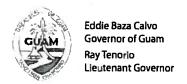

- BME & Sons: The firm submitted a total bid price of One Hundred Fourteen Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty Dollars which represents \$34,730.00 more than the government estimate.
- Asia Pacific International: The firm submitted a total bid price of One Hundred Twenty Three Thousand One Hundred Thirty Six Dollars which represents \$43,136.00 more than the government estimate.

Recommendation

As a result of our review of the bid documents submitted, Allied Builders & Construction has been determined to have met the standards of responsibility and responsiveness as outlined in the Guam Procurement Regulations and has been deemed to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

Therefore in accordance to 3109(n)(2) of the Guam Procurement Rules and Regulations, the recommendation is to award the contract to Allied Builders and Construction in the amount of \$69,900.00 for the above referenced project.
