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MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS Thursday, August 20, 2015

I. CALL TO ORDER

There being a quorum, the regular meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 12:00 p.m., Thursday, August 20, 2015. Present at the meeting were:

Absent was Mr. Felix R. Pangelinan, Deputy General Manager (Operations). Also present were Senator Tom Ada's office-Blaine Dydasco; Marianas Variety-Jasmine Stole; EA Engineering-Richard Price and Port Management staff.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Kernaghan made motion to approve the minutes of July 1, 2015 and July 22, 2015 subject to correction. The motion was seconded by the Vice Chairman and was unanimously passed.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT

- a. **Public Comment:** None.
- b. **Employee Comment:** None.
- c. <u>PAGGMA Association</u>: Report was made that the PAGGMA association is providing support and assistance to the Port's Labor Day Committee and has issued donation requests for this event. Port Committee Co-Chair mentioned that logistics are currently being finalized. The Port tent is located behind the Guam Visitors Bureau in Tumon. Labor Day is scheduled on Sunday, September 6, 2015. The Chairman advised to extend invites to the Port tenants.

IV. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The General Manager's report was provided for Board's information. Following key item(s) are noted as follows:

- 1. Port Opens New Terminal Gate Complex: The Port in coordination with MARAD, EA and Black Construction announced and opened its new Terminal Gate Complex and Container Yard on August 3, 2015. The 3.7 acre Gate Complex includes three new gate stalls, four lanes, a three generator load center, high mast lighting, storm water infrastructure, and domestic water and fire suppression system that includes 274,000 gallon concrete water tank. In addition, the new container yard covers 4.6 acres in size. The new facility is the third and final phase of the \$50M Guam Commercial Port Improvement (GCPI) Program. The overall project is slated for completion in October 2015. A formal ceremony for the entire completion of the GCPI Program is scheduled for December 9, 2015.
- 2. <u>Tropical Storm Goni (16W)</u>: In response to Tropical Storm Goni, the Port began preparation plans on August 15, 2015. Condition of Readiness 4 was declared on August 16, 2015 and the Port returned back to normal conditions. The only damage as a result of the storm was the chain-link gate at the former Gatehouse which has since been repaired.
- 3. <u>Typhoon Chan-Hom (09w)</u>: First week of July, port operations were impacted with the arrival of Typhoon Chan-Hom. Port maintenance personnel addressed the securing of the cranes, other port equipments and facilities. Condition of Readiness 4 was declared on July 5, 2015. There were no major issues with the Port as a result of this typhoon.
- 4. **FEMA Reimbursement for Typhoon Dolphin:** The Port filed its request for reimbursement to FEMA as a result of Typhoon Dolphin in the amount of \$75,465.64. In response, FEMA's reimbursement to the Port was only \$17,033.86. The Port then filed an appeal with FEMA requesting \$64,367.67 in overtime labor cost and benefits and \$11,097.97 for equipment expenditures. Administrative labor/cost related was not considered allowable cost by FEMA for reimbursement; therefore, the total request by the Port for reconsideration is \$66,959.27.
- 5. <u>Credit to Port's Administration Building Tenants</u>: The Port Admin Tenants impacted by the fire incident on June 1, 2015 will be credited for office space lease and common area fees for the months of June and July 2015.
- 6. Tractor Donation from Matson: On July 28, 2015, Matson notified the Port that they sent a letter to the Governor on July 24, 2015 with information that the Port is in urgent need of cargo handling equipment and that Matson has the ability to donate up to five yard tractors which will be used to service all carriers. While Matson is aware the Port had initiated the process to procure close to \$5M additional equipments to include yard tractors, there was an immediate concern that Port's existing fleet of tractors may go out of commission and cargo movement will be further delayed. Donations made to the Government of Guam is guided and

authorized by 5 GCA, Section 22408. The five tractors arrived on island August 12, 2015 and the Port has completed with processing all of the necessary documents.

- 7. Final Approval for the Port's \$2 Million Dollar USDA Community Facility Direct Loan: A loan closing was held on July 15, 2015 for the \$2M USDA CF direct loan to fund the acquisition of cargo handling equipment that includes eight tractors, four 5-ton forklifts, a compact articulated boom, two portable dual operation welding machines, a telescopic boom lift and an industrial street sweeper.
- 8. **PUC Hearing Scheduled for Port Contract:** Public Utilities Commission will hold its regular meeting on August 27, 2015 to address PAG Docket 15-05 relating to the Port's Owners/Agent Engineer Services Agreement. Management will be participating in this meeting.
- 9. <u>Designation of Port's Counsel to Serve as Special Assistant Attorney</u>
 <u>General</u>: In response to the Port's request, the Attorney General provided a formal letter on July 10, 2015 indicating that Port's counsel has been designated as a Special Assistant Attorney General. This designation will provide the Port counsel the authority to review procurement solicitations and contracts that are estimated to result in an award of over \$500K.
- 10. Port 2015 Liberation Float: The Port won 3rd place in the Government of Guam category in this year's Liberation Day Parade.

Mr. Alfred F. Duenas, Deputy General Manager of Admin/Finance (DGMA) presented the items under the budget transfer request. He noted that specific to item (b), the funding source identified should reflect CIP Upgrade 1st Floor Men's Restroom Admin Building account; all other requests remain. As to items (c) and (d), Mr. Kernaghan mentioned that the funding source identified for those two items are from the Insurance Workers Compensation account, and asked

whether there would be sufficient funds to support WC expenditures for the remainder of this fiscal year. DGMA replied positively.

Mr. Kernaghan made motion to approve items (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) budget transfer requests accordingly as presented, seconded by the Vice Chairman. Motion was unanimously approved.

3. **Procurement Contract Services:** Mrs. Alma B. Javier, Procurement Manager presented the contract summary update and requests for Board authorization for the Port to exercise the option renewals in accordance with the respective contracts. Mr. Kernaghan asked whether the option renewal terms were included in each of the original contracts. Mrs. Javier replied positively and that the end-users have provided memorandums of satisfactory contract performance and requests to proceed with extension renewals.

Mr. Kernaghan made motion that all the procurement contract extensions brought before the Board in today's meeting are extended through the period as stated on the attachment. Motion was seconded by the Vice Chairman and was unanimously approved.

General Port Operations

Procurement of Port Equipment

On Wednesday, August 26, 2015, the Port was notified that protest was filed by a bidder that resulted in the Stay of Procurement Status on the Port's acquisition of two (2) Top Lifters. The original bid announcement by GSA was published on Friday, July 31, 2015. However, the original bid package and specifications were transmitted to GSA since Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Once received, GSA in turn transmitted the bid package and specifications to the Office of the

Attorney General for review and concurrence on Thursday, June 25, 2015. On Monday, July 6, 2015, the Office of the Attorney General returned the bid package to GSA with instructions to forward the document to the Port's legal counsel Phillips & Bordallo for review as the designated Special Assistant Attorney General. On Thursday, August 13, 2015, an amendment was filed to extend the bid opening from Monday, August

17, 2015 to Monday, August 31, 2015. Then on Tuesday, August 25, 2015 an amendment was filed extending the bid opening from August 31, 2015 to Friday, September 4, 2015. The additional questions from the bidders and timeline responses from the Port delayed the anticipated bid opening by three (3) weeks.

The Port submitted its response to GSA denying the bidder's protest Tuesday, September 1, 2015. To date the procurement of the Top Lifters is on hold pending the outcome of the protest.

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As for the additional equipment to be procured by the Port, the Port submitted its procurement documents to GSA on Monday, July 13, 2015. The Port was informed that the different types of equipment from tractors to forklifts are being broken down in to separate bid packages. The Port was informed that the public announcement should be published this week.

Removal of Port's Container Village and Status of Construction for Renovated Offices

The Port's container village was removed by the Port's insurance contractor on Monday, August 31, 2015. The Port's tenants, CTSI and Inchape, have since been returned back to their office space. However, there are requested renovations by Cabras Marine to expand their office space into a portion of Matson's former footprint that will extend the timeline before Cabras is able to reoccupy their office space.

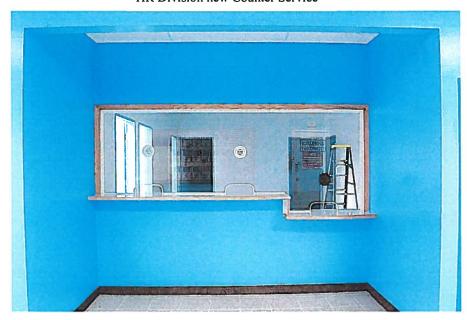


Removal of Temporary Container Office Space.

The Port is also addressing additional concerns with the Guam Fire Department (GFD) to include additional fire alarms to be located in the renovated offices spaces. The next inspection by GFD is scheduled for

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Port's Assistance with Business Sector Disaster Damage Assessment (BSDDA) for Tropical Storm Goni

The Port staff once again provided assistance with the Business Sector Disaster Damage Assessment (BSDDA) regarding negative impacts to business that may have resulted from Tropical Storm Goni. The assessment commenced on Monday, August 17, 2015 and the Port team included Administrative Assistant Betty Wusstig-Perez and Administrative Assistant Jacqueline Cruz. According to Ms. Wusstig-Perez, "Of the fifty six (56) businesses identified, forty nine (49) were assessed with seven (7) unavailable. " She further stated that the survey forms were submitted to the Bureau of Statistics and Plans that is responsible for preparing a report to the Governor of Guam within seventy-two (72) hours after the island is returned back to Condition of Readiness IV.

The Port's Area of Responsibility (AOR) includes the villages of Asan, Piti and Cabras Island.

National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) MAP-21 Federal Program Funding

On Tuesday, August 25, 2014, the Port was notified by the Department of Public Works Director and Governor's Highway Safety Representative Glenn Leon Guerrero that the Port was awarded \$24,850.00 for Police Traffic Services under the Operation "a dai he' hao (Watch Out!) Program for FY 2016. The funding will be provided to Port Police to address the following: target speeding, crashes related to speeding, reckless driving, imprudent driving and unsafe driving habits along the roadways.

The Port's jurisdiction for enforcement includes Route 11, Route 1 to Hagatna Marina and Route 2 to the Agat Marina.

This grant award is %100 federally funded. The GM signed off on the FY 2016 Grant Project Agreement with DPW on Wednesday, August 26, 2015.

In FY, 2015, the first year of Port's Police participation in the Highway Safety Programs, the Port was awarded \$26,812 for overtime cost incurred for enforcement activities, Port participation at the National Lifesavers Conference and the purchase of a Laser Speed Gun that the Port acquired in July of this year.

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PUC Hearing for Port Contract

On Thursday, August 27, 2015 the Port attended the PUC's regular business meeting to consider the following request from the Port:

PAG Docket 15-05, Petition for Approval of Owners/Agent Engineer Services Agreement with Parsons Brinckerhoff, ALJ Report, and Proposed Order.

Attending on behalf of the Port were the GM, Deputy GM for Administration and Finance Alfred Duenas, Deputy GM for Operations, Felix Pangelinan, Procurement Manager Alma Javier and Commercial Manager Glenn Nelson.

PUC Counsel Fred Horecky provided an overview to the Commissioners on the Port's request for the approval of its Owners/Agent Services Agreement and presented the findings of Administrative Law Judge Joephet R. Alcantara who determined that the Port's petition "appears commercially reasonable and not burdensome." He also reported that the agreement will not have a negative impact on rate payers due to the source of the funding being provided by the federal government.

As a result the PUC voted to approval the Port's Petition for an Owners/Agent Engineer Services Agreement with Parsons Brinckerhoff at a cost of \$1,380,000.00.

PUGG Meeting for the Month of August 2015

The monthly PUGG Meeting was held on Thursday, August 20, 2015. Present on behalf of the Port were the GM, Operations Manager John Santos, Transportation Superintendent Ray Santos and Safety Administrator Vince Acfalle.

Present on behalf of the PUGG were MSA Representative Byron Valera, Mell Representative Edward Cruz and Ambyth Representatives Greg David and Joe Guerrero.

Operations Manager Santos initiated the meeting by discussing the status of the new Gatehouse since it's opening on the morning of Monday, August 3, 2015. Overall, he informed the PUGG that the new gate procedures have been very successful and added that eventually when the Gate Operating System (GOS) is acquired, the gates will be man less. He went on to discuss the procedures with the seals on the containers and the current pilot program with Matson to improve the processing of the containers. Mr. Santos stated that last year the Port coordinated with Customs and Quarantine to implement a pilot program with Matson to facilitate the processing of containers that may have very minor discrepancies with regards to the seal number. He provided an example such as a seal number that may be listed on one document as "0010" but may be listed on the seal as "001." These discrepancies require further review and correction

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before a container can be released and this has been a source of frustration for the truckers. Mr. Santos added that he is aware that the other carriers would like to see this pilot program extended to them as well.

Mr. Santos also discussed the weekly progress meeting with G4S for the installation of the Terminal Operating System (TOS) and the ongoing training that will be provided to the Port employees operating the system in September and October of this year. He stated that the Port is aiming for March of 2016 for the implementation of the new TOS which is much anticipated considering the current TOS is an antiquated system.

Mell Representative Ed Cruz inquired if the TOS system would be able to track and report the status of the refrigerated containers? Mr. Santos responded that the new system will convert the current paper system to a paperless system. He added that the Yard will be marked down to match the computer tracking system to identify the location of every container in the Yard from the time it is unloaded, reloaded, or leaves the Port Yard. He stated that there are still challenges ahead and that the new TOS will have modules that can still be added to expand the system, but also relayed that additional technology will cost a "pretty penny."

Mr. Santos went on to discuss the ongoing challenges in the Yard to maintain the flow of operations and still work around the current construction projects such as the water line installation and the Oil Water Separators that are located throughout the Yard. He also discussed the current equipment challenges that have slowed down the movement of cargo to, from, and within the Yard. He added that with the recent typhoon in Saipan, there is more cargo including 200 power poles that have been loaded on barges.

Ambyth Representatives Greg David inquired about the status of the Port's procurement process. The GM responded that the Port does not have full delegation to procure its supplies and parts. The Port does have delegation authority from Public Works for its construction projects and its professional services contracts. Mr. David replied that perhaps this is an area that the PUGG can assist the Port to work with the legislature and restore the Port's procurement authority. The GM stated that the Port has currently assigned two of its employees to the General Services Agency (GSA) to facilitate Port procurement documents. She also stated that the Port can undertake multi-million dollar construction projects but cannot procure its own toilet paper. There is something wrong with this process. The GM also stated that the Port has had three (3) years of clean audits and is only one of two departments in the entire Government of Guam that has this status. The GM elaborated on the training that was undertaken by the Procurement Division and the Procurement Manager at GCC to obtain procurement certification. She added that additional personnel will be sent to the same training this year. The GM relayed that the Port would still have to follow the same procurement requirements, but would be in a better position to move

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forward its priorities if it controlled its own procurement process. The GM also provided examples of the requirement to wait for the Government of Guam to procure tires before a vendor for the Port could be identified to procure tires for its Top Lifters. Without operating Top Lifters at the Port, there will not be much of any cargo moving out into the community.

Mr. Cruz and Mr. David both inquired if other accommodations can be made for the carriers and truckers to come into the Yard and get containers after hours to offset, equipment limitations. Mr. Santos responded that the Port provided this access services in the past and can do so again. He stated that additional gate hours can be provided and late gate services can be extended on Wednesdays and Thursdays as needed. Both gentlemen replied that these are ways that the needs of the carriers and truckers can be accommodated due to equipment delays in the interim. Mr. Santos replied that he will follow-up on this request.

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GFD Rescue Office at Gregorio D. Perez Marina

On Friday, May 15, 2015 the GM received a letter from Guam Fire Department (GFD) Chief Joey San Nicolas for the Port's assistance in providing space at the Gregorio D. Perez "Hagatna" Marina to re-establish Rescue Unit 2 to respond to water related emergencies. Fire Chief San Nicolas relayed that GFD that during the renovations of the Hagatna Marina, Rescue Base 1 was demolished, thus requiring the relocation of Rescue 2 to the Sinajana Fire Station. Due to the distance of Rescue 2, from the marina, GFD is not able to respond as quickly to water related emergencies. Chief San Nicolas referenced two (2) fatalities that had occurred at the mouth of the marina in recent years that may have resulted in a different outcome had GFD been present at the marina during these unfortunate incidences.

Chief San Nicolas further relayed that GFD has received federal funding that will allow the department to acquire a container/modular structure and reestablish GFD's footprint at the marina. The container/modular building will not be permanent in nature and will have elevated footings to minimize the impact on the surrounding areas.

The location of the GFD building will require the relocation of the Port's flagpole and Gregorio D. Perez memorial monument by a few feet by the project contractor. The new office facility will include the installation of security cameras and monitoring devices to be utilized by the Marina Manager.

The Port is awaiting construction plans for the container building and an onsite inspection was conducted on Wednesday August 26, 2015 with the Port's Engineering Division.

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Paseo De Susana Fishing Platform Project



On Wednesday, September 2, 2015, a ground breaking ceremony was held by the Guam Department of Agriculture to announce the commencement of construction for the Paseo De Susana Fishing Platform Project. The project will provide a platform that will be 136 feet long by 15 feet wide and will be used for the purpose of recreational and subsistence fishing. The platforms will also construct concrete surfaced ramps and decks to include a railing system that will be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

The construction cost for the project is \$549,370.00 and is funded by the Western Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Council, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Sport Fish Restoration Program, Guam Department of Agriculture and the Guam Organization of Saltwater Anglers.

The Port Authority of Guam entered into an MOA with the Department of Agriculture and the Department of Parks and Recreation on March 7, 2013 to develop the fishing platform

for Paseo De Susana Fishing Platform Project. The fishing platform will extend over submerged property that falls under the Port's jurisdiction.

Port Safety Issues

Spider's Found in Container

On Monday August 17, 2015, the GM received a report from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning possible Black Widow spiders that were found in a 40 ft. container (TCLU 800763) that was being devanned by the Container Freight Station (CFS) Building. He reported that Cargo Checker Supervisor Joseph Tajalle had provided the report to the Safety Office.

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Mr. Santos further reported that around 9:25 a.m. that morning, Port Police and Customs and Quarantine were immediately contacted to conduct their own inspection when more spiders were also found. Devanning operations were suspended. At 10:20 a.m. that morning Customs arrived and collected samples of the spiders that were examined by Department of Agriculture's Entomologist Dr. Russel Campbell who determined that "spiders were non-latrodectus spiders in which generally are considered less dangerous to humans then the black widow spiders. It also does not require the vessel to be furnigated."

At about 10:20 a.m. Customs and Quarantine Officer's arrived and collected samples of the spiders to be examined by Dr. Campbell, Entomologist. Also, the devanning of the container (TCLU 800763) was stopped temporarily until clearance by Dr. Campbell.

Mr. Santos concluded his report by stating that "At about 2:30p.m., 8/17/15 Customs and Safety cleared the container to be devanned. The container was furnigated with insecticide."

Damage to Tractor #84

On Friday, August 21, 2015, the GM received a report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas concerning damage to Tractor # 84 that was being operated by Equipment Operator II George Camacho while he was draying containers to be loaded on the vessel Kyowa Rose. According to Mr. Salas, Mr. Camacho was located under the hook of Gantry #6 while awaiting a container for loading. During this time Mr. Camacho opened the right window of the tractor for ventilation when the glass was stopped by an exposed metal screw, causing the rear glass window to shatter.

Mr. Salas determined during his inspection that the metal screws that were designed to hold the rubber stoppers were missing or may have fallen out as a result of wear and tear. Upon further review of the "daily trip ticket" Mr. Salas stated that the form was filled out and the section for the left and right window were checked off as "okay" and indicated that the operator may not have checked to determine if the rubber stoppers were in place or already missing.

Mr. Salas recommended that all tractor operators be advised to inspect their sliding windows for proper rubber stoppers and properly report deficiencies to their supervisor.

Mr. Salas further recommended that this incident be discussed by the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to be forwarded to the General Manager.

Damage Pavement at F-4

On Saturday, August 22, 2015 the GM received a report from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning damaged pavement at F-4 that resulted from the use of a single wooden plank below the ramp on the vessel Kyowa Rose while the vessel was listing and scraping the pavement.

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Mr. Santos further reported that that vehicles and break-bulk cargo were being loaded using the vessel Kyowa's ramp. He also stated that Port Police, the MSA agent and the Chief Mate of the Kyowa Rose were notified and acknowledged the incident.

Mr. Salas further recommended that this incident be discussed by the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to be forwarded to the General Manager.

Hydraulic Oil Spill from Top Lifter #09-04

On Tuesday, August 25, the GM was forwarded an incident report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas that was generated on Wednesday, August 19, 2015 by Safety Inspector Kenneth A. Santos (Detailed) concerning a hydraulic oil spill from the main mast on Top Lifter #09-04. As a result, Mr. Santos shut off the Top Lifter and reported the incident to Supervisor

According to Mr. Santos, Equipment Operator III Ted Cruz was operating Top Lifter #09-04 near Area X when he noticed fluid leaking from a hydraulic hose. As a result, Mr. Santos shut off the Top Lifter and reported the incident to his Supervisor Mike Taijeron.

Mr. Santos reported that sand was used to clean up the spill and the National Response Center (NRC) was notified of the incident under Case # 1126039. He estimated that around two (2) gallons of fuel spilled from the faulty hydraulic hose.

Hydraulic Oil Spill from Top Lifter #09-06

On Wednesday, August 26, 2015, the GM was forwarded an incident report from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning a hydraulic oil spill from Top Lifter #09-06 that was operated by Equipment Operator III Kevin R. Sanchez. According to Mr. Santos, Mr. Sanchez was assigned to ground containers at area HB3. While he was in the process of discharging a 20 ft. container, he noticed hydraulic fluid leaking from the left side of the Top Lifter's spreader.

Mr. Santos reported that approximately 1 ½ gallons of hydraulic oil had spilled out from the hydraulic hose. He also reported that Heavy Equipment Mechanic II William M. Hudson determined that a faulty high pressure twist lock hose was the cause of the oil leak. Mr. Santos further stated that the National Response was notified of this incident and issued Report #1126694.

Mr. Santos concluded his report and recommended that this incident be discussed at the next Safety Briefing for Transportation and further discussed by the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to be forwarded to the General Manager.

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Hydraulic Oil Spill from Top Lifter #09-04

On Friday, August 28, 2015, the GM was forwarded an incident report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas concerning a hydraulic oil spill from Top Lifter #09-04 that was operated by Equipment Operator III Jacob Aquiningoc while he was grounding containers at Area Z. According to Mr. Salas, Mr. Aquiningoc noticed the oil leaking from a busted hydraulic hose line on the mast of the Top lifter that was cracked from wear and tear. Mr. Salas estimated that approximately one (1) gallon of hydraulic oil had leaked out and was cleaned up with absorbent pads and sand. The National Response Center was notified and issued Report #1126830.

Mr. Salas determined that the primary cause of the incident was a faulty hydraulic hose.

Mr. Salas concluded his report and recommended that this incident be discussed at the next Safety Briefing for Transportation and further reviewed by the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to be forwarded to the General Manager.

Work Injury

On Friday, August 28, 2015, the GM was forwarded an incident report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas concern a work injury sustained by Stevedore Benny Cruz while he was unrigging cables from cement poles being loaded unto Barge S-7000 at F-4 by Gantry #6. During this process, Mr. Cruz was unhooking the web sling from a pole when one of the 4x4 wood beams that were used to separate the poles snapped in half striking Mr. Cruz on his right chin. Mr. Cruz complained of pain and swelling to his chin.

Mr. Salas reported that the required Workers Compensation 201 and 202 forms. However, Mr. Cruz refused medical treatment at the time of the incident.

Mr. Salas stated that the primary cause of this incident was the damaged 4x4 wood beam that broke in half during the loading process.

Mr. Salas recommended that this matter be discussed by the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to be forwarded to the General Manager.

Hydraulic Oil Spill from Top Lifter #09-06

On Thursday, August 27, 2015, the GM received an incident report from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning a hydraulic oil spill on Top Lifter #9-06. According to Mr. Santos, Equipment Operator III Albert E. Santos was operating Top Lifter #9-06 when he was assigned to transport Gantry #4 spreader to the Crane Mechanic Shop for repair. While he was attempting

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to position the Top Lifter's spreader, he noticed that hydraulic oil was leaking from the makeshift drip pan under the Top Lifter.

According to Mr. Santos approximately eight to (8) to ten (10) ounces of hydraulic fluid spilled onto the pavement at F-3 and absorbent pads were used to clean up the spill. The National Response was notified and issued report #1126795.

Mr. Santos also reported that Bunker Operator for IP&E Michael D. Francisco noticed the oily substance on the pavement at F-3 and reported the incident to the Safety Office.

Mr. Santos concluded that the cause of this incident was returning Top Lifter #9-06 back into operation until all proper repairs were completed.

Mr. Santos also recommended that this incident be discussed on the next safety briefing for Fleet Mechanics and then forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to the General Manager.

Hydraulic Oil Spill from Top Lifter #09-04

On Thursday, August 27, 2015, the GM received an incident report from Safety Inspector II John T. Santos concerning a hydraulic oil spill on Top Lifter #9-04. According to Mr. Santos, Equipment Operator Ted R. Cruz was operating Top Lifter #9-04 and had been assigned to load power poles onto Barge S-7000. While Mr. Cruz was awaiting a rigging setup, the front right side of the spreader started leaking hydraulic fluid.

Mr. Santos reported that Heavy Equipment Mechanic II to Renato G. Jardeleza, determined that the cause of the hydraulic fluid leak was from a faulty O-right on the spreader's solenoid.

Mr. Santos also reported that approximately ½ quart of hydraulic oil spilled onto the asphalt near 1100 bollard at F-4 and relayed that absorbent pads were used to contain and clean up the spill. The National Response was notified and issued Report #1126800.

Mr. Santos concurred with Mr. Jardeleza's determination that the cause of this incident was a faulty O-ring on the spreader's solenoid.

Mr. Santos also recommended that this incident be discussed on the next Safety Briefing for Fleet Mechanics and then forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to the General Manager.

Hydraulic Oil Spill from Tractor #76

On Wednesday, September 2, 2015, the GM received an incident report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas concerning a hydraulic oil spill from Tractor #76. According to Mr. Salas, Equipment Operator II Ronnie Sablan was operating Tractor #76 and had been assigned to relocate chassis to Area P when he noticed oil leaking onto the ground. He determined that the oil was leaking from a cracked seal in the 5th wheel lift cylinder on the left side of the tractor.

Mr. Salas reported that approximately 1 (one) quart of hydraulic oil had spilled during this incident and that absorbent pads and sand had been used to clean up the spill. The National Response Center was notified and issued Report #1127315.

Mr. Salas also recommended that this incident be discussed on the next Safety Briefing for Fleet Transportation and then forwarded to the Accident Review Board to provide recommendations to the General Manager.

Industrial Incident Involving Tractor #92

On Wednesday, September 2, 2015, the GM received an incident report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas concerning an industrial incident involving Tractor #92. According to Mr. Salas, Operator II (Casual) George Camacho was operating Tractor #92 in Area P when he attempted to maneuver a 45 foot container into a stall when he misjudged his turn and struck a parked Matson van (Ford/350/L/P#MG737). This resulted in damage to the rear fender of the parked van and minor damage to the bumper of Tractor #92.

Mr. Salas reported that the Mr. Jesse Pereda was the operator of the van and had parked his van to check on the status of the reefers.

Mr. Salas determined that the primary cause of the incident was inattention and haste on the part of Mr. Camacho.

Mr. Salas concluded his report by recommending that this matter be reviewed by the Accident Review Board to provided recommendations to the General Manager.

Invasive Species Found in Shipping Container

On Friday, September 4, 2015, the GM received an incident report from Safety Inspector III Paul Salas concerning the discovery of Black Widow Spiders that were found in a 40 (forty) foot container (MATU 253861) that was being de-vanned at the Container Freight Station (CFS). According to Mr. Salas, Stevedore Leader George Quidachay reported the incident and notified the Safety Office. Once the spiders were discovered the Safety Office immediately notified the

Department of Customs and Quarantine who discovered more spiders during further inspection of the container. De-vanning operations on the container were suspended.

Mr. Salas reported that Customs and Quarantine collected samples of the spiders that were then examined by Department of Agriculture Entomologist Dr. Russel Campbell who determined that the spiders were Black Widow Spiders.

*The GM is awaiting a completed report from the Safety Division on the treatment procedures implemented with the content of the container to exterminate the spiders.

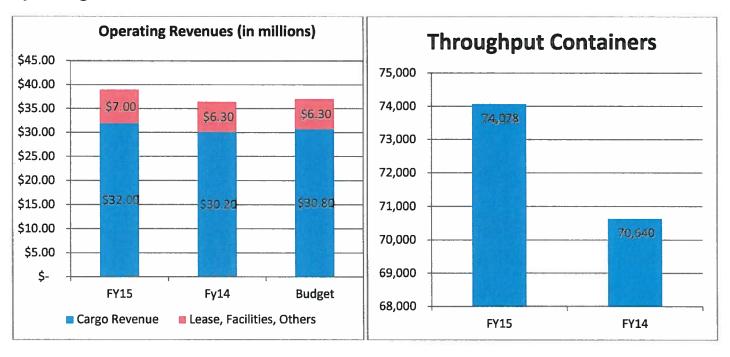

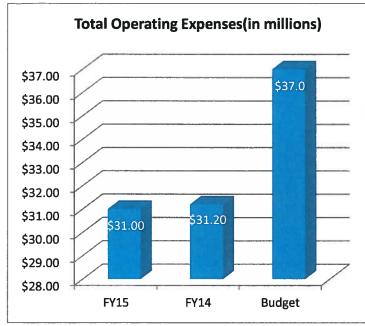
Total Operating Revenues as of July 2015 was \$39 million, which consist of \$32 million in cargo revenues and \$7 million in Facilities, Leases, and Other Services.

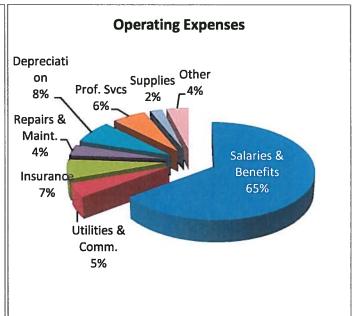
FY15 YTD cargo revenue is 6% higher than last year's total (\$30.2 mil) and 4% higher than Budget (\$30.8 mil).

FY15 YTD Facilities, Leases, and Other Services as of July is 13% higher than last year (\$6.3 mil) and 14% higher than budget (\$6.3 mil).

Overall Operating Revenues as of July is 6% higher than Budget (\$37.1 mil) and 8% higher than last year's year to date July (\$36.5 mil).

Total number of containers handled as of July 2015 was 74,078 which is 5% higher compared to last year July total 70,640.





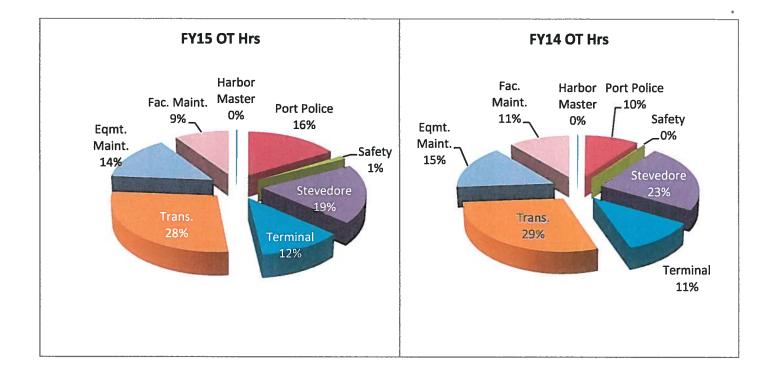
Total Operating Expenses as of July 2015 was \$31 million, which is 17% lower than Budget (\$37 mil) and 1% lower than last year's total operating expenses (\$31.2 mil).

Total Overtime as of July 2015 was \$1.4 million which is 39% higher than last year July (\$967 thousand). Direct Labor Revenue as of July was \$2.3 million, which is 5% higher than last year and 15% higher than budget. Direct Labor charges are for services performed by Port employees under special service request and differentials under the throughput.

Year to date Operating Revenues minus the Year to date Operating Expenses resulted to an Operating Income of \$8.4 million as of July 31, 2015.

Non Operating Revenues and Expenses consist of the following: \$2.3M-Retirement contribution for COLA, Supplemental and Medical/Dental/Life Insurance expenses, \$643k-Interest expense on loans, \$2.8M Federal Reimbursements and 102k Interest Income. The net total of non operating expenses and revenues as of July is a positive \$564 thousand.

The Total Net Income as of July is \$8.9 million.

Accounts Receivable Trade (net) as of July 31, 2015 is \$6.2 million.

Aging Status is a follows: 54% - Current, 21% - over 30 days, 2% - over 60 days, 1% - over 90 days and 22% - over 120 days.

Accounts Payable Trade as of July 31, 2015 is \$1.6 million which is 36% higher than last month ending balance of \$1.2 million.

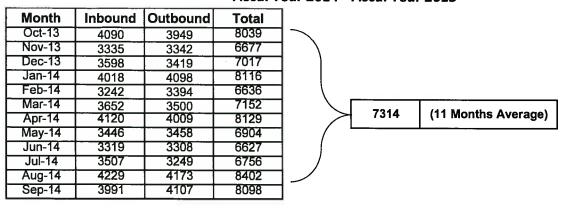

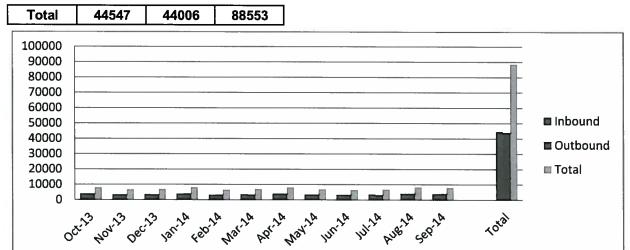

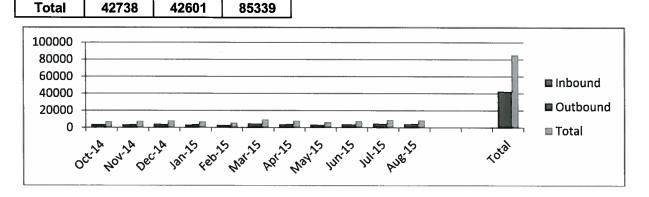

Gantries 4, 5 & 6 were utilized and with **downtime status as follows**: Gantry 4 had 2.2 hrs downtime due to spreader & power problems; Gantry 5 had 10.7 hrs downtime due to problems with its power, spreader, hoist, twistlock, trolley, gantry, chain, & performing engine check; Gantry 6 had 5.1 hrs downtime due to problems with its lights, spreader, power cable, & adding engine oil.

Dear Ms Brown:

This is in response to the email Request for Proposal from Mr Simeon Delos Santos on 16 June and in compliance with discussion in our meeting on 18th June in the Engineering Department office. This is expected to be the final Task Order under the subject IDIQ Contract that is expected to expire in October 2015.

The scope of engineering and design services under this Task Order is outlined as follows:

- 1. Replacement of Chassis Wheel Stop Bumpers. Add Landing Gear Pads.
 - a. Provide design for mass produced precast reinforced concrete wheel stops using high strength concrete for long term durability.
 - b. Provide layout plan indicating location for installation of replacement wheel stops wherever required.
 - c. Provide design for concrete landing gear pad for use where chassis are parked on asphalt pavement. Top of pad to be flush with asphalt pavement.
 - d. Provide layout plan indicating the location for landing gear pads taking into account chassis for 20-foot, 40-foot and 45-foot containers.
- 2. Container Yard Striping & Numbering Required for inventory tracking.
 - a. Provide specification on layout drawing for surface preparation and paint to be used for striping and numbering.
 - b. Provide layout for striping at chassis parking locations. Take into account new layout as necessary to keep rows and spaces in uniform alignment and to conform to light pole and fire hydrant layout with minimal loss of spaces.
 - c. Provide design and layout for signs to indicate row designation for convenient

d. Provide a plan of the chassis parking area with numbering painted on the concrete or asphalt pavement for each parking space.

3. Gantry Crane Rail and Pedestrian Striping

- a. Provide specification and color scheme as notes on layout drawings for safety marking at gantry crane rail location. Include instruction on surface preparation.
- b. Provide layout drawing for marking on pavement along the length of the gantry crane rail line for safe passage of workers and other authorized pedestrians.
- 4. Additional Reefer Plugs 50 each to be fed from LC-4. Not included in scope.

5. Trench Drain Repair and Upgrade

- a. Provide a typical design to replace the current grate trench covers with a slotted drain inlet system suitable for supporting heavy traffic while allowing rapid run off of storm water. Provide the design of typical cleanout system.
- b. Provide layout drawings of the existing drainage system using the slotted drain inlet in lieu of grate trench cover together with cleanouts for removal of debris that enters the drain trench. Indicate location of existing oil/water separator structures.
- c. Provide inventory of repairs to be made to the existing drainage trench.

6. Container Yard Pavement Repair

- a. Provide a detailed visual survey of the existing container yard and inventory all damage to asphalt and concrete surfaces requiring repair. This will require multiple site visits in order for containers and chassis to be relocated to accommodate the survey. Note that in addition to surface cracks and spalls in concrete, distress failure was observed in some areas requiring full depth replacement. Damage to asphalt surface was observed in addition to bird baths and lack of coverage at the margins in some locations.
- Provide container yard site plans at suitable scale to depict surface damage using a series of codes that will be clear to a contractor for pricing and work execution.
- c. Provide detailed drawings depicting the method of repair for concrete cracks and spalls and asphalt raveling and other damage. Notes on detailed drawings will provide detailed instructions on repair materials and methods.

7. Yard Lighting Repair

a. Provide layout drawing depicting the location of four (4) each light poles and luminaires needing to be replaced and one (1) each additional light pole and luminaires. Include layout of power fed to each pole, using existing conduit where feasible along with new cabling.



- b. Provide detailed drawings and specifications for 50-foot light poles and luminaires together with foundations. Use same specifications and details as used for the lighting upgrade at the existing container yard in 2011/2012 where AmOrient Engineering was the designer/CM and DCK Pacific was the contractor.
- 8. Fire Hydrant Adjustments and Valve Replacement
 - a. Conduct a site survey to determine the location of fire hydrants and fifteen (15) each gate valves.
 - b. Provide layout drawings indicating the location of fire hydrants and underground gate valves.
 - c. Provide detail for adjusting the height above ground of fire hydrants that are set too low. Provide detail of guard rail to be constructed to protect fire hydrants from collision by vehicles transiting through the area.
 - d. Provide detail drawings and specification (on drawings) for removal of existing below ground gate valves and replacement with new. Provide detail for asphalt pavement repair and valve cover plate or hand-hole.
- 9. Provide all the foregoing in a technical package to be used by PAG for advertising for bids as a single design-bid-build package.

The fee proposal that follows is predicated on the following:

- A. Background drawings for plan views and trench drain layout and details will be provided by others in CAD format. The same drafting conventions will be used throughout as established for the design activity under MARAD and EA Science, Engineering and Technology.
- B. The area to be addressed in this task order is limited to the existing container yard and does not include the recently extended container yard and break bulk storage area.
- C. The final design submission is to be complete on or before 30 September 2015.
 Documents for the task order will be submitted at 35%, 90%, pre-final and final design stages.
- D. Provision is made in this proposal for twelve (12) each meetings during the design phase including review meetings at conclusion of each stage of design.
- E. Provision is made in this proposal for the review and approval of up to fifty (50) technical submittals from the contractor following award of the construction contract. This is to be accomplished by email communication.
- F. Provision is made in this proposal for up to thirty (30) each site visits as requested by PAG for clarification of design intent or for quality assurance.

RESOLVED, the Board of Directors hereby approves the revised Classification Specification Standards of the Port Authority of Guam as recommended by the Civil Service Commission; and be it further

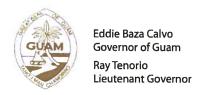
