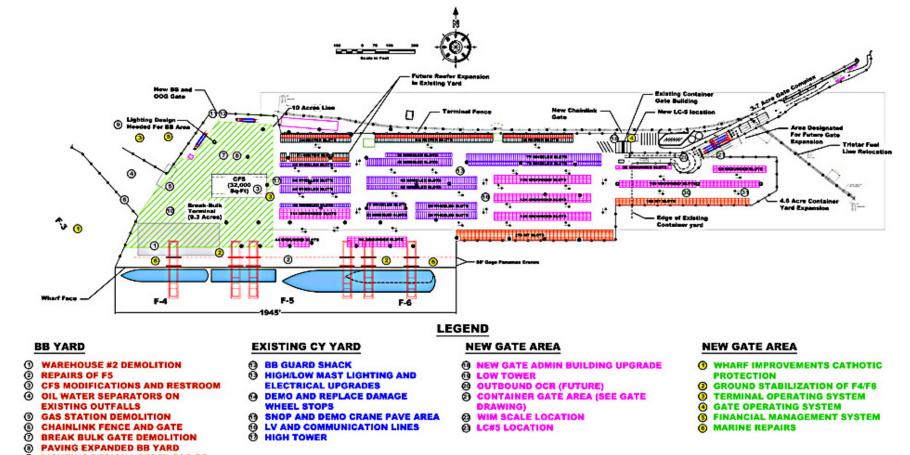

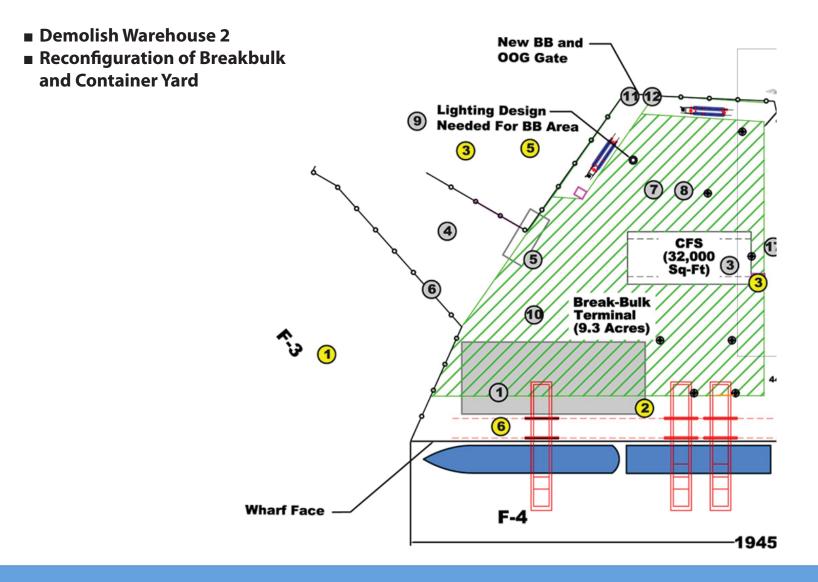

STORAGE AREA KEY

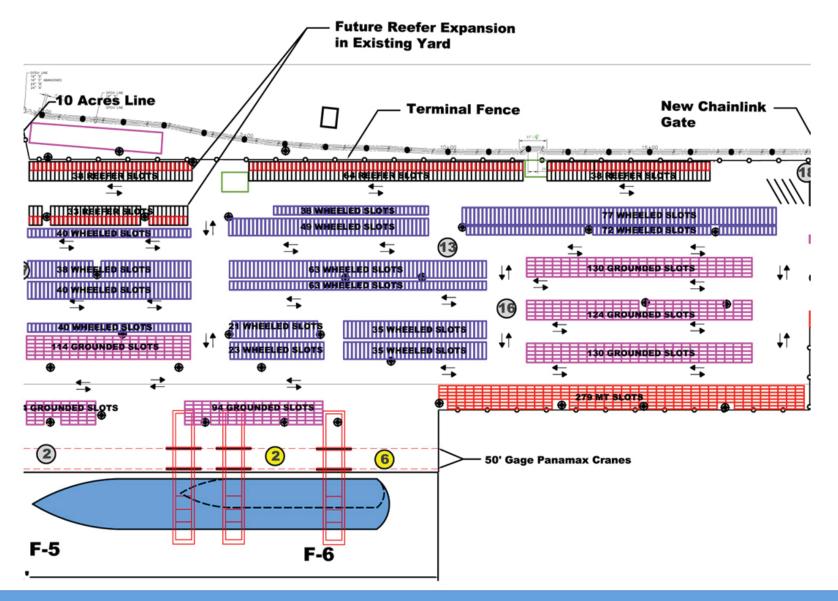

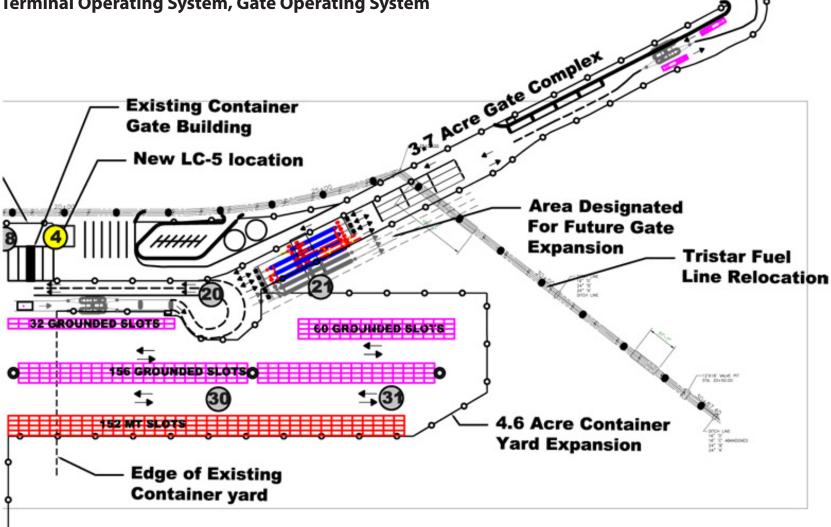
- September 16, 2011 PAG and MARAD agree on Scope of Work for Implementation Plan
 - Major Components of Modernization Implementation include:



- Replace Existing High Mast Lights
- Limited Infrastructure Improvements (fire, water, electrical, security)
- Security Fencing



- - Container Yard Expansion
 - New Gate Structure
 - Terminal Operating System, Gate Operating System



• October 6, 2011 – MARAD announces position to focus DOD Funds (\$50M) for waterfront replacement and delay Implementation Definition and Uplands Work until additional in-water studies, geotechnical assessment, seismic risk assessment and expanded environmental document is completed.



Timeline on Balanced Approach

Balanced approach includes uplands work, service life extension waterfront maintenance and repair, and information technology upgrades.

September 16, 2011	PAG and MARAD agree on Scope of Work for Implementation Plan	
October 6, 2011	MARAD informs PAG that DOD-IG wants waterfront facility risks mitigated	
October 19, 2011	PAG Board of Directors informs MARAD to continue with agreed SOW that focuses on the uplands work	
October 19, 2011	Port Users Group supports balanced modernization approach	
November 6, 2011	Governor writes to MARAD supporting a balanced approach to implementing the modernization program	
November 8, 2011	Legislature passes resolution affirming a Port-balanced modernization program	
November 18, 2011	Congresswoman Bordallo writes to MARAD requesting consideration of PAG's request on balanced modernization approach	

Status: MARAD has not responded to PAG's request

NEPA Compliance

Environmental Assessment Document

June 5, 2011	PAG provided MARAD draft environmental assessment for comments	
November 17, 2011	PMT informed PAG that MARAD will task them to complete environmental assessment document	

November 18, 2011 – MARAD informs PAG of intent to move forward with wharf assessments for F-4 thru F-6

- Status of NEPA Compliance for IP
 - Environmental Assessment awaiting completion of geotechnical (seismic) wharf investigations

January 2012	Estimated start date of EA by MARAD
August 2012	Estimated completion date

Timeline provided by MARAD for geotechnical findings (seismic investigations of wharves) to determine required levels of both waterfront and uplands related development.

December 2011	Notice to Proceed to geotechnical firm
February 2012	Estimated geotechnical completion date
March 2012	Final wharf assessment to be completed
August 2012	Completion of Environmental Assessment by MARAD

September 6 & 8, 2011	Working sessions held with PAG and MARAD on review of their manual. PAG's comments finalized

October 22, 2010	USDA Approves CF Direct Loan for Port Modernization Program
November 14, 2011	PAG submitted letter to lender providing updates on PAG financial updates and tariff rate petition increase of 3.9% in our cargo handling charges that are comparable to market-based rates to the Public Utilities Commission

\$25 Million Community Facilities Guaranteed Loan

October 22, 2010	USDA approves CF Guaranteed Loan for Port Modernization Program	
June 3, 2011	PAG submitted updated documents and forms to USDA	
November 14, 2011	PAG provided lender with updates on financials, and 3.9% tariff rate increase petition with PUC	
December 20, 2011	USDA informed of PAG plans to notify lender of intent not to use the Guaranteed Loan	

Current Status:

- \$50M Guaranteed/Direct Loans cannot be executed until IP fully defined
- USDA unwilling to expend their funding on in-water work
- Conflicting requirements between USDA and financial institution
- PAG to inform financial institution of intent not to use \$25M guaranteed loan
- PAG requested extension of \$25M direct loan until September 30, 2012 and is awaiting response
- PAG requested extension of \$14M guaranteed-direct loan for cranes until March 2012 and is awaiting response

Gantry Crane Acquisition Activities



Procurement of Gantry Cranes Timeline

September 11, 2009	Public Law 30-57, requires acquisition of two gantry cranes by December 2012	
October 2011	Inspection of POLA Cranes and Gantry 3 by third party conducted	
November 17, 2011	Public Law 31-145, PAG authorized to engage in the negotiations with the Carriers as an option	
December 19, 2011	POLA negotiation team formed	
December 20, 2011	First POLA team briefing	
January 3, 2012	PAG provided comments to draft Assessment Report	
January 13, 2012	Final Assessment Report to be transmitted to Governor and Guam Legislature	

Agenda Item - Action Plan and Way Forward

Follow up on the Guam letters to MARAD...have meeting with DOD-IG to:

- Confirm whether DOD-IG or JGPO seems to be driving MARAD toward a "replace waterfront" scenario
- Describe PAG desired waterfront service life extension approach and balanced modernization approach
- Educate them on various funding constraints (USDA Loan limitations, uncertain cargo flow, crane financing)
- If DOD-IG concurs, reassert to MARAD the Guam position on Balanced Program Approach
- If MARAD doesn't agree, take the marine work off the table and limit their work to the Uplands portion

Finalize IP and Funding Plans

- PAG would need to review and determine the following:
 - What will the DOD money pay for?
 - o What will the USDA CF Direct Loan pay for?
 - How will crane purchase be financed?
 - o How will crane retrofits and recurring O&M be financed?
 - o Revenue projections, cash-flow, and tariff adjustment plans



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
