The service provider shall take corrective action within twenty-four (24) hours of nolice from the Government, and the service provider shall notify the Government when action has been taken. If the service providers fail to take corractive steps within twenty-four (24) hours of notice from the Government, then the Government in its sole discretion may suspend temporarily and contract for services until corrective action has been taken.

[X] 18. BRAND NAMES: Any reference in the Solicitation to manufacturer's Brand Names and number is due to lack of a satisfactory specification of commodity description. Such preference is intended to be descriptive, but not restrictive and for the sole purpose of indicating prospective bidders a description of the article or services that will be satisfactory. Bids on comparable items will be considered provided the bidder clearly states in his bid the exact articles he is offering and how it differs from the original specification.
[X] 19. DESCRIPTIVE LITERATURE: Descriptive literature(s) as specified in this solicitation must be furnished as a part of the bid and must be received at the date and time set for opening Bids. The literature furnished must clearly identify the item(s) in the Bid. 1. BID FORMS: Each bidder shall be provided with one (1) sets of Solicitation forms. Additional copies may be provided upon request. Bidders requesting additional copies of said forms will be charged per page in accordance with 5 GCA $\S 10203$ of the Government Code of Guam. All payments for this purpose shall be by cash, certified check or money order and shall be made payable to the PORT AUTHORITY OF GUAM (EO B6-24).

## 2. PREPARATIONS OF BIDS:

2.0 Bidders are required to examine the drawings, specifications, schedule, and all instructions. Failure to do so will be at bidder's risk.
2.1 Each bidder shall furnish the information required by the Solicitation. The bidder shall sign the Solicitation and print or type his name on the Schedule. Erasures or other changes must be initialed by the person signing the bid. c) Should any contract contain a renewal clause, then at the time of renewal adjustments there shall be stipulations contained in that contract for applying the Wage Determination, so that the Wage Determination promulgated by the U.S Department of Labor on a date most recent to the renewal date shall apply. 5 GCA § 5801
d) In addition to the Wage Determination detailed above, health and similar benefits for employees having a minimum value as detailed in the Wage Determination issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor shall apply. Contractor shall pay a minimum of ten (10) paid holidays рег аппum per employee. 5 GCA § 5802
e) Any violation of Contractor or its subcontractor's obligations of this section shall be investigated by the Guam Department of Labor and may include a monetary penalty assessment by the Guam Department of Labor of no less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per day, and no more than One Thousand Dollars ( $\$ 1,000.00$ ) per day, until such time as a violation has been corrected, as well as the payment of all back wages and benefits due. 5 GCA § 5803
f) In addition to any and all other breach of contract actions the Government of Guam may have under this procurement, in the event there is a violation in the process set forth in subsection (e) above, Contractor may be placed on probationary status by the GENERAL MANAGER of the General Service Agency, or its successor, for a period of one (1) year.

During the probationary status, a Contractor shall not be awarded any contract by any instrumentality of the Government of Guam. A Contractor who has been placed on probationary status, or has been assessed a monetary penalty pursuant to S G.C.A. Article 13 Title 5 may appeal such penalty or probationary status to the Superior Court of Guam. 5 GCA $\S 5804$
gl Contractor along with all proposed Offerors and submitter under this procurement were required to submit a Declaration of Compliance with Wage Determination laws as part of this procurement with a copy of the most recent Wage Determination for Guam and the Northern Marianas Islands issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor. 5 GCA \$5805
h) The applicable USDOL Wage Determination Rate Revision (as defined by subsections (b) and (c)) is to this Agreement. Contractor agrees to provide upon written request by the Government of Guam written certification of its compliance with its obligations as part of each invoice, along with the names of any employees, their positions, and detailed wage and benefits paid in keeping with this section. Additionally, upon request by Government of Guam the Contractor shall submit source documents as to those individuals provide direct services in part or whole under this Agreement and its payments to them of such wages and benefits.
16. ETHICAL STANDARDS: With respect to this procurement and any other contract that the Contractor may have, or wish to enter into, with any government of Guam agency, the Contractor represents that it has not knowingly influenced, and promises that it will not knowingly influence, any government employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in the Guam Procurement Law and in any of the Guam Procurement Regulations.
17. PROHIBTION AGAINST' CONTINGENT FEES: The Contractor represents that he has not retained any person or agency upon an agreement or understanding for a percentage, commission, brokerage, or other contingent arrangement, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies, to solicit or secure this Agreement or any other contract with the government of Guam or its agencies.
18. CONTRACTOR'S WARRANTY AS TO EMPLOYEES AND SEX OFFENSES, Reference 5 GCA 5253 (b) Contractor warrants that no person providing services on behalf of the Contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 of GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA , or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry.

Contractor warrants that if any person providing services on behalf of Contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA , or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction. Any contactor found in violation of this section, after notice from the Government of Guam, after notice from the contracting authority of such violation, shall within twenty-four (24) hours, take corrective action and shall report such action to the contracting authority. Failure to take corrective action with the stipulated period may result in the temporary suspension of the contract at the discretion of the Government of Guam.
19. ### 1.0 PAG HAZARDOUS AND NON-HAZARDOUS ENVIRONMENTAL WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES

## 12 MO.

"Packing, Transportation and Analytical Finger Printing Services for Disposal of Hazardous Waste, Non-Hazardous Waste, Universal Waste and Used OiI Disposal Generated by Equipment Maintenance, Emergency Spill Response and or Expired Shelf Life Items"

SCOPE; The Contractor shall provide all labor, tools, materials, supplies, equipment, supervision and personnel required to furnish Hazardous Waste (HW). Non-Hazardous Waste (NHW), Universal Waste (UW) and Used Oil Disposal Services, to include Testing and Sampling, completion of minifests, materials, equipment, labels, packaging, transportation, analytical finger printing and disposal of hazardous waste by means of incineration, fuel blending, and/or reclamation/recycling for Port Authority of Guam. The contractor shall adhere to these requirements in accordance with (IAW) all terms, conditions, provisions, schedules, and specifications of this SOW, in addition to all local, state, federal regulations und guidelines.

Offerors are to provide price-per-pack charges only. This price must be INCLUSIVE of ALL other costs, including but not limited to items as listed per the SOW, i.e., packaging, labor for preparation and packaging, administrative costs to provide required documentation, etc.

## CATEGORIES OF WASTE SUBJECT TO THIS SERVICE

Hazardous Waste (HW): Any waste material or mixture of wastes which is toxic, corrosive, flammable, and reactive. HW includes extremely hazardous material. This also includes all materials identified by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA); Subtitle C, 40 CFR, Parts 260-265.
Note* PAG may request for waste removal on a monthly basis rhough drum may not be at its full capacity.

Universal Waste (UW): EPA's UW regulations streamline HW management standards for federally designated "universal waste" shall include: batteries, pesticides, mercury-containing equipment, and bulbs (lamps). UW regulations are set forth in 40 CFR part 273.

Non-hazardous Waste (NHW): Any type of industrial waste which, according to regulations cannot be added to a dumpster or sewage line (i.e. Absorbent Pads, Sand or Boom generated during equipment maintenance or spill response, expired shelf life items.)

Used Oil Disposal: Contractor responsibility to conduct Total Halogens (TH) Fiekd Test Kit to ensure Used Oil doesn't meet the 1000 ppm Total Halogenated Spent Liquids definition as Hazardous Waste. All used oil to be pump out from oil storage tanks and drums. Contractor will provide collection and laboratory testing if needed for reclamation. Contractor will also provide disposal tracking document identifying total amount of gallon pump out and number of containers.

If Used Oil fails the 1000 ppm Total Halogenated Field Test Contractor is to inform COR Representative ASAP. Contractor will also sample oil and send to laboratory for identification of spent solvents. Contractor is also responsible to pomp out and drum up oil to be ship out as hazardous waste. Contractor will cleanout storage tank that contained 1000 ppm TH and bring tank back for PAG to reuse.

In Order to meet the CONUS Requirements contractor responsibility to perform further sampling and tested needed for oil to be accepted at state side for reclamation

## REQUIREMENTS:

The Contractor shall perform disposal services, which includes the collection, preparation and packaging on site, shipping and disposal in compliance with all existing laws and regulations of the United States including, but not limited to EPA Hazardous Waste Regulations in 40 CFR Part 260; EPA storage and disposal regulations in 40 CFR 761 et seg.:
to ensure safe handling of the hazardous waste. All employees present al the work site shall be trained to use all protective equipment. Prior to commencement of
contract performance, Contractor shall provide references and record of required training.

Spills: The Contractor shall report all spills and personnel exposures during waste preparation, packaging or shipping to the PAG Environmental Specialist. The contractor shall be responsible for, and bear the cost of, cleanup. The contractor shall be responsible for all spills and shall provide all labor, equipment, and personal protective equipment required or needed for the cleanup of hazardous waste. Clean up shall be considered complete only upon the final inspection and clearance by the PAG Environmental Specialist.

Packaging: The contractor shall provide necessary personnel and all required materials to inventory, classify, sample, manifest, package, mark, label, and load the waste for transport. When repackaging is necessary the contractor shall be responsible for disposal of the original containers.

When regulations permit a choice of packaging material, extra packaging integrity shall be utilized. For example, the contractor shall use a steel container instead of a fiberboard container where DOT regulations permit either. Each item of hazardous material will be at least double containerized. For example, waste sulfuric acid will not be shipped in "poly carboy" alone; the carboy will be placed inside a steel drum and the containers shall be separated by nonreactive, non-combustible packaging material; e.g. vermiculite.

Incompatible waste shall not be packaged in the same outermost container. Once the contractor begins work, all processes of packaging and pick-up shall continue until all waste is transported off site to the disposal facility.

Transportation: The Contractor shall have required EPA and state registry for hazardous waste transport and shall also have verifiable records of good shipping practices which may be checked through local DOT authorities. The Environmental Protection Agency Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest shall be used unless superseded by other requirements.

Certificate of Disposal and Land Disposal Restriction: The contractor will provide a copy letter or Certificate of Disposal (COD) and

Note***Due to the distance from Guam to the disposal site and the vessel authorize to carry regulated waste for disposal which causes non-compliance with the 10-day transportation requirements, contractor who are awarded regulated waste disposal contract must submit letter to Port Authority Gental Manager requesting for temporary storage for waste already destine for disposal. All waste must be removed as soon as possible from port compound 10 days prior to arrival of shipping vessel.
