Regional Resiliency Assessment Program Begins



On Monday, November 14, 2022, Port General Manager Rory J. Respicio delivered opening remarks for the kickoff of the Guam/CNMI Regional Resiliency Assessment Program (RRAP).

The Port has been nominated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) for Guam and CNMI to receive a comprehensive cyber and physical security assessment of the Port Authority of Guam and the Commonwealth Ports Authority.

CISA leads the national effort to understand, manage, and reduce risk to our cyber and physical infrastructure. The goal of the Guam/CNMI Regional Resiliency Assessment Program (RRAP) is to generate greater understating and action among public and private sector partners to improve the resilience of our region's critical infrastructure. The program also will resolve infrastructure security and resilience knowledge gaps, will inform risk management decisions, identify resilience-building opportunities and strategies and improve critical partnerships among stakeholders.

The kickoff meeting at the Guam Museum was hosted by the Port Authority of Guam and includes participation from local and federal government agencies, private sector, and NGO partners who will all be involved in the assessment.





Port General Manager Rory J. Respicio spoke November 15, 2022 at the Guam Industry Forum 2022 held at the Dusit Thani Guam Resort.

Respicio was a panelist for the "Ports of Entry and Logistics" panel discussion. focused Respicio on progress being made at the Port to modernize the island's only commercial seaport.

"For the next 10 years, we're going to see almost \$15 billion in military construction, and the Port Authority of Guam is going to be ready to receive all those cargo because we're not going to wait for the what-ifs. " Respicio told the crowd during his presentation.

New Gate Booths Build Resiliency at the Port



Progress continues at the Port Authority of Guam as the agency has completed the construction of new concrete gate booths.

The two new state-of-the-art gate booths replace the smaller corroded metal booths and are a part of the Port's efforts to modernize the commercial seaport. The gate booths are the entry and exit points for all inbound and outbound cargo.

"This is a perfect example of hardening our facilities and building resiliency within our yard which aligns with Governor Lou Leon Guerrero and Lt. Governor Josh Tenorio's first priority of the 2018 Transition Report, to modernize port facilities to include upgrading the terminal operating system," said Port General Manager Rory J. Respicio. "Replacing the metal gate booths with concrete structures will better sustain against the harsh environmental conditions associated with operating the island's only commercial seaport."

Each booth has increased in size to improve functionality for operations with the expected lifespan of 20 to 30 years.

The expansion of each gate booth and related adjustments include:

- Lengthening communication lines;
- Electrical wiring and conduit;
- Relocation of hose bib and associated plumbing;
- New lighting fixtures and new air-conditioning systems, 9K BTU mini split unit;
- New CCTV cameras; and
- New aluminum glass door & windows that can withstand a minimum of 170MPH sustained wind velocity.

Construction on a third gate booth is ongoing and is expected to be finished by the end of this month. The total cost to upgrade all three booths was \$159,557.00 and was entirely funded by the Port Authority of Guam. The project was contracted out to Pacific Federal Management, Inc.



GPA Generators Arrive at the Port



Twelve Guam Power Authority (GPA) Module generators arrived to Guam in November and were off-loaded onto the Port Authority of Guam's yard for staging prior to transport to it's ultimate destination at the GPA Ukudu project site in Dededo by late January or early February, depending on permitting from the Department of Public Work (DPW).

Coordinated effots between the Port Authority of Guam and GPA were made to mitigate storage fees due to the Port in the range of \$3.5M-\$4M, particularly by way of assistance from GPA toward integrating the Port's power system.

"I shared the Governor's concern that the storage fees would be passed onto GPA ratepayers with our Board and they agreed to extend the Port's ratefree storage period based on extenuating circumstances," said Port General Manger Rory J. Respicio. "While the goal is to get the equipment out as soon as possible, we want to ensure it doesn't come at the expense of the community."

A total of twelve (12) separate modules arrived, consisting of four (4) separate types with three (3) counts of each. Of the four module types weighing in between 123.5 and 173.9 tons, a total of 2,302.5 tons were unloaded into the Port yard.

To accomplish the task of unloading this equipment to its staging site within the yard and transporting the generator modules to GPA's Dededo site, Ambyth Shipping brought in a self-propelled modular transporter (SPMT) which hydraulically and electronically links individual transporters into any combination to provide a support platform matched to the characteristics of the load and route. The model RSG4 transport system brought in is an unrivalled method for the safe and effective transport of the largest loads which added an additional 150 tons onto the yard.



Thanksgiving Luncheon

The challenges of the global pandemic tested the Port's resolve at a time when half of the world had closed its doors due to COVID-19. "Your willingness to go above and beyond the normal call of duty has helped to make the Port Authority what it is today, a shining example to other government agencies.
