GTA files amendment with FCC

Piti, Guam, July 3, 2023: The General Manager of the Port Authority of Guam has written to the Federal Communications Commission regarding the supplemental filing by GTA TeleGuam.

"As noted in the supplemental filing, GTA TeleGuam made diligent efforts to obtain accurate information for the new filing including cross-checking multiple media sources against the data being released by various government entities," Port General Manager Rory J. Respicio stated in his letter sent today to FCC Acting Chairwoman Jessica Rosenworcel. "We support this filing as their amendment is now factual and we wish them the very best with their Emergency Petition."

Respicio last week sent a letter to the FCC and the Chairman of the Board of GTA TeleGuam expressing concerns about misinformation contained in the Emergency Petition by GTA TeleGuam.

"GTA's swift action to amend and supplement the Emergency Petition shows their willingness to submit accurate information to the FCC," Respicio wrote today. "We truly thank them and appreciate their efforts to provide a more accurate description of the tremendous work the government, private-sector, and non-profit organizations have to recover from Typhoon Mawar."

Cargo and fuel processed since reopening

The following fuel and cargo commodities have been processed and released into our island community since reopening the Port on Sunday, May 28, 2023:

- 3,199 containers with dry goods;
- 488 refrigerated containers ("reefers");
- 2,204 bundles of rebar; 2 boxed steel pipes; 75 bundle steel plates;
- 1,265 vehicles;
- 230 units of general cargo;
- 2 excavators, 34 backhoe, 4 trucks, 6 tractors; 2 dump trucks, 3 fuel trucks, 1 drill rig; 3 school bus; 1 bucket truck, 1 flatbed truck, 2 office trailers, 1 trailer, 1 air burner, 5 water tankers, 1 truck screener; 1 modified container; 1 boom lift; 1 fork lift; 1 telehandler; 1 boom truck; 1 water truck; 1 boat with trailer
- 1 bundle of chassis; and
- 5 barges – fuel operations.
